Tokyo Hikes Claims of U. S. Navy Losses In Hawaiian Attack

New York, July 7—(P)—The Tokyo radio broadcast today a Japanese navy ministry recapitulation claiming "complete results" of the Pearl Harbor attack were five U. S. battleships, two cruisers and one tanker sunk and four battleships, six cruisers and two destroyers damaged.

These figures, the latest in progressively advancing claims since the attack, compared with the actual losses which Secretary Knox announced on Dec. 15 as one battleship three destroyers, a target ship and a minelayer lost and one battleship and a number of other vessels damaged. One of the destroyers listed as lost—the Shaw—subsequently was repaired and is back in service.

The Japanese, in their first claim on Dec. 9 said two battleships and a minesweeper were sunk and four battleships and four cruisers were damaged, and still later went so far as to say the American fleet had been "wiped out."

New York, July 7—(P)—Promoter Mike Jacobs today announced a ten-round non-title fight between Middleweight Champion Freddy (Red) Cochrane and his No. 1 challenger, undefeated Ray Robinson, on September 10 in Madison Square Garden for the benefit of the United Service Organizations. Cochrane is a boatswain's mate in the navy, stationed at San Diego, Calif.

103-Year-Old Letter Reveals Details of Wild Chase, Lottery

Springfield, Ill.—(AP)—A wild chase by stage-coach, a poker game for high stakes, a lottery ticket worth \$25,000 and a confession to grand larceny made up a story revealed in a 103-year-old letter found recently in the archives vault at Springfield.

The letter was written in 1839 by Orin Hamlin soon after he had stolen \$11,500 of state funds. He told John Dixon of the State Board of Commissioners how he had fled on a river boat and had subsequently lost \$8,000 of the money in a poker game.

Dixon and a companion immediately started a pursuit by stagecoach that carried them through most of the Eastern states. Unable to locate Hamlin,
