

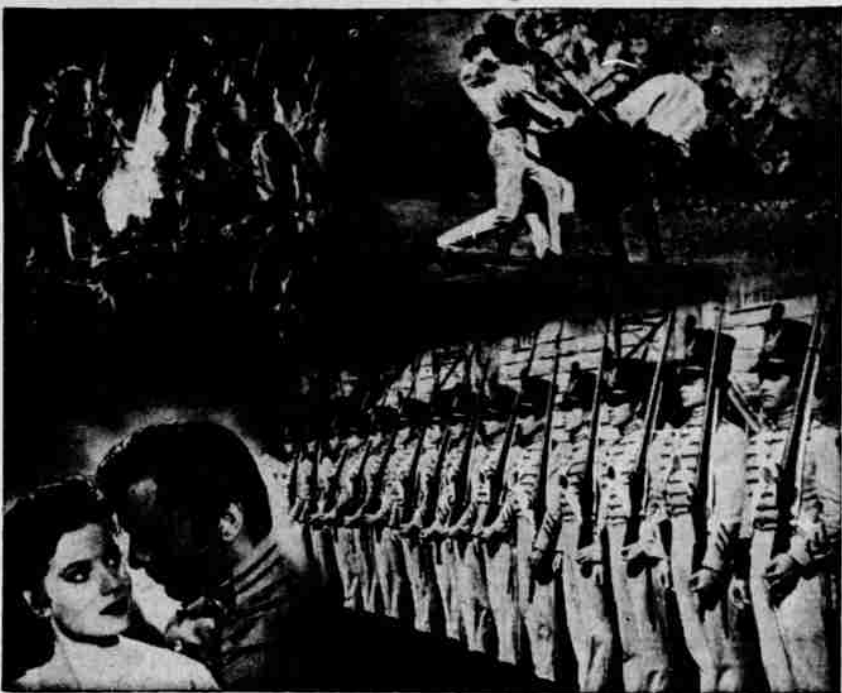
MEDCO WORKERS GIVE HEAVILY TO USO FUND DRIVE

Medford Corporation employees made an excellent showing in their subscription to the USO drive which has been under way in Jackson county for the past few weeks, according to C. E. "Pop" Gates who headed the county campaign. He reported today that \$555.50 was subscribed by the corporation employees under the leadership of A. W. Lingaas.

Gates said the contribution by the Medford Corporation employees was the most complete success of any payroll solicitation in any drive conducted in the county. Lingaas announced today that 95 per cent of the employees subscribed to the call for funds.

It is anticipated that the drive will go "over the top" before the close of the week, Jackson county having set its quota at \$7,000 in cooperation with the nationwide campaign to raise funds for USO recreational centers for military men throughout the country.

SPANISH WAR VETS SELECT OFFICERS

Astoria, Ore., July 9.—(P)—United Spanish War Veterans named Henry C. Gates, The Dalles, department commander at the closing session of the state meeting yesterday and adopted a resolution calling for universal conscription.

All property, energy and industrial production should be drafted "that we may be all out for defense and victory in fact as well as in theory," the resolution declared.

Hood River was chosen for the 1943 session.

Other officers named included E. A. Smith, Portland, senior vice-commander; L. W. Wiperman, Grants Pass, junior vice-commander; E. H. Shea, Portland, inspector, and Mrs. Louis M. Butts, Portland, auxiliary president.

PACKING PLANTS READY MACHINES

Packing plants of the valley are now making repairs to machinery and generally getting ready for the packing season, expected to start between August 10 and 15. Some of the packers are making new lug boxes, and repairing old ones. No cannery prices on Bartlett's, to be harvested first, are expected much before the end of the month, and there is no hint of what the price per ton will be.

Under the present weather the pears are developing satisfactorily, although there are some reports of scab.

FREIGHTWAYS TO BUILD TERMINAL ON NO. CENTRAL

Consolidated Freightways Incorporated announced today that work had been started on the new freight terminal to be located on North Central avenue, on the old Radovan property, south of the Crystal Laundry.

L. C. McCorkle, agent for the Freightways in Medford, said original plans called for a \$25,000 plant but due to priorities only the first unit of the intended building is being constructed. The unit to cost \$5,000 will be 66 feet long and 48 feet wide and will include office and warehouse space. McCorkle stated that the terminal will be modern in every respect and compare favorably with terminals elsewhere.

Roy Johnson is contractor for the project and work is already underway on the footings. Considerable grading is expected on the lot. Future plans call for a large warehouse facing the railroad tracks, McCorkle stated, behind the building under construction.

ASTORIA MAYOR DIES SUDDENLY AT CLUB

Astoria, Ore., July 9.—(P)—Astoria's mayor, Dr. W. C. Logan, 79, died suddenly yesterday while reading a newspaper in the Elks club.

Long active in city political life, he was serving his first term as mayor.

\$231 Subsidy From Ashland to Secure Camp Bus Service

Ashland, July 9.—(Sp.)—A subsidy payment of \$231.35 will be paid by the Ashland chamber of commerce to the Rogue Valley Transit company as its payment under the contract where the bus company agreed to operate necessary bus schedules between Ashland and the cantonment at a commute rate of 40c per round trip, which justified the designation of Ashland as part of the army camp installation defense area.

The payment covers the period of May 25 to June 24, according to data presented at the city council meeting last night. The report showed the bus company had hauled a total of 4,627 passengers on the Ashland-cantonment run during the month up to June 24, averaging about four round-trip schedules daily. The contract continues up to October 1, 1942.

New York, July 9.—(P)—George Sherry, 46, began serving today a three-month workhouse sentence for dismantling and selling his 76-year-old mother's bed to get money for liquor. Peter Schlavis, 31, was held in \$1,000 bail accused of breaking the jaw and blackening both eyes of his 65-year-old mother because she refused to give him money for liquor.
