

HITLER WILL MAKE SUICIDE IS BELIEF OF SCHOOL MATE

Oklahoma Farmer Tells of Boyhood Days of Schicklgruber in Vienna School.

Arpaha, Okla. (U.P.)—Adolf Schicklgruber would have had a hard time of it going to school if Stanley Mark, a Custer county, Okla., farmer and old school-mate of Adolf's, had any idea of the trouble he was to start.

"Oh, if I had only known 40 years ago what kind of man was Hitler . . ." Mark said, grimacing. He doubled his work-hardened fists, eyes flared.

Mark and the lad named Schicklgruber went to school together, 40 years ago, in Vienna.

"We was joost young boys going to trade school and we would run to not be late, Adolf and me and the other boys," Mark said.

Sullen in Classroom

He recalled that once in a classroom, the instructor asked the students of their ambitions. All answered except Adolf. He sullenly lowered his head and "sat like a dunce while instructor keep asking him."

"He was stubborn like a jack-ass," the lanky thick-muscled 53-year-old dirt farmer said. "He still that same way. I think," he added, smiling. Hitler was studying to be a paperhanger. Mark was studying the shoe-maker's trade.

"Good student? No. He would joost sit and look at nothing. He was like that always," Mark explained, in a booming, slightly accented voice.

Hitler Wouldn't Fight

"Yes, he was like some by the boys," Mark said, when asked about Hitler's personality, "but he was funny. He would never fight. We was not bad boys, but we like to fight sometimes—lots of times. He wouldn't fight. Maybe he was coward then like now."

About the present war, Mark said: "I tell everybody we got to fight. That Schicklgruber, he is going to make war till the last man is gone. Dead. Then he is going to make suicide you watch you."

Mark went on to tell about Hitler's love for coffee, his aversion to girls and about the little cottage he and his mother lived in. Hitler, he said, wore patched, but clean clothes to school. "His mother was good woman," Mark said. "She work hard to make him good boy. Now he is doing this. He is no good, Ach."

Mark now has another score to settle with the man who changed his name to Hitler. Mark's brother, a farmer in German-occupied Sudetenland, pulls his plow by hand. The Germans confiscated his horses. To Mark, whose ideas about farming are modern and involve use of tractors and cultivators, the fact his brother pulls his plow by hand is the worst scar of slavery.

Last Seen in 1902
The Custer county farmer last saw his former schoolmate in 1902. He came to America in 1906, settled in Oklahoma near

JAPAN MAY BEAT ALLIES TO PUNCH WITH NEW FRONT

Nippons Planning to Strike Russia in Asia is Belief—Reds May be Ready.

New York, July 24.—While allied leaders discuss the problem of diversionary attacks to ease Nazi pressure on the embattled Russian armies, there is a continuing possibility that the Russians will face a new front in Asia even before Britain and the United States can open up any sort of second front in western Europe.

Japan is believed to have upward of 500,000 troops (some sources estimate as many as 750,000) stationed in Manchukuo and easily accessible parts of northern China.

Airplanes Ready

A strong proportion of the Japanese air force also is based in Manchukuo, according to the best available information, with additional facilities—air fields, fuel supplies, spare parts, repair bases—long since completed so that combat operations could begin the moment the needed extra planes had been flown in from China or the Japanese home islands.

If the Japanese should attack Siberia (and the Aleutian occupation well may have been a move to protect their flank for such an operation) there is little likelihood that it would be set in motion, however, before late September or early October.

Primary target of such an attack would be, presumably, Russia's maritime provinces, and July and August are months of cloying heat and heavy rains along most of the lowland Siberian-Manchukuo border.

Conditions are at their worst now for troop movements through the densely wooded valleys of the Ussuri and Amur rivers, whose broad, generally shallow courses mark off most of the boundary between Siberia and Manchukuo.

Burial with full military honors of 29 crewmen of a German submarine sunk by a destroyer on Atlantic patrol has been announced by the navy as the Associated Press unofficial count of allied and neutral ship losses by submarines in the western Atlantic rose to 396.

The navy declined to give further details of the sinking of the U-boat whose 29 dead were buried at Hampton, but in announcing the recent destruction of three more merchantmen declared the captain of one was machine-gunned because he refused to give the submarine commander the name of his vessel.

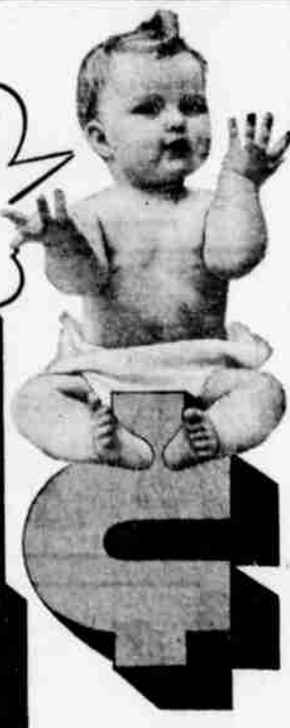

been indications, however slight, that the Russians feel they are prepared to meet anything the Japanese may throw at them. Still sticking to their principle of keeping all their military developments strictly secret, the Soviets nevertheless have hinted that their Siberian armies and air force are in full fighting trim.

There is no definite information on the strength of these Russian armies. Estimates have ranged all the way from 300,000 to 600,000 troops, with the possibility that some divisions had their baptism of fire in helping stall the Germans' winter offensive in Russia. These forces are said to be backed up by 600 to 700 planes, while based chiefly on Vladivostok are fleet units reported to include 70 submarines, some 30 torpedo boats and other small vessels.

MORGENTHAU CALLS FOR HUGE TAX BILL BOOST

Washington, July 24.—(U.P.)—Secretary Morgenthau called for a two and one-half billion dollar boost in the tax bill today with a warning that only bold war taxation could bring America a sound economic future.

He appealed to the senate finance committee to increase the house-approved \$6,271,000,000 tax measure to a minimum of \$8,700,000,000. Substantially, the administration asked the same revenue from the same sources proposed to the house months ago.

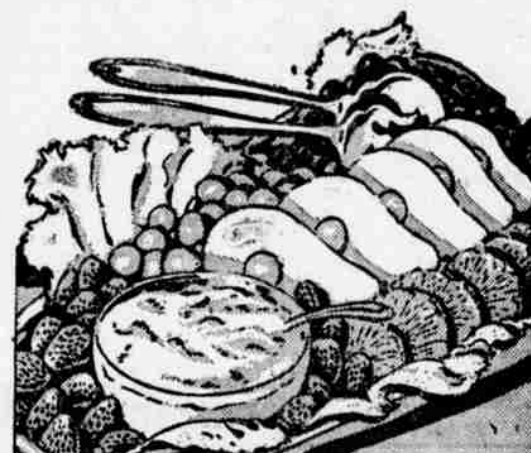
