

BUS DEPOTS FOR TROOPS IN CITY NEAR CAMP, PLAN

As a means of meeting the transportation problems of Camp White soldiers, two bus waiting stations will be constructed in Medford and three will be built on the Crater Lake highway in the 91st division area, it was announced yesterday following a meeting between Major General Charles H. Gerhardt, 91st division commander, and the Jackson county coordinating board.

The Medford waiting stations, each to be four feet wide and 18 feet long, will be located on North Riverside avenue between Fifth and Sixth streets in front of the AAA office, and on the east side of North Riverside avenue just this side of the new cloverleaf intersection under construction near the Big-Y. Rogue Valley Transit company will provide the labor for the stations, the army the lumber.

Soldiers leaving Camp White for Medford will board buses at the three waiting stations on the cantonment area, and those returning to the camp from Medford will use the stations located in the city. The Rogue Valley Transit company has 31 buses at present, and eight more will be added to the fleet in the near future.

Civilians desiring to give soldiers rides are requested to pick them up at any of the waiting stations. In this connection, General Gerhardt's headquarters announced there would be no hitchhiking by members of the 91st division.

Gift Of Camp Radio By Mrs. S. S. Smith Honors Gen. White

A brightly glowing remembrance of a prized friendship brought a much needed radio to the enlisted personnel of Camp White, it was revealed today by Col. Owen R. Meredith, commanding officer.

The radio was donated by Mrs. S. S. Smith, 723 West 11th street, prominent Medford matron.

Acceptance of the gift by the 91st division brought out the story of Mrs. Smith's long-standing friendship with the late General George White, for whom the present camp was named, and his wife. She told of a deep affection and friendship as close to her as a family relationship. Mrs. Smith said that she felt it was only right and proper to return to the camp personnel, in the form of the radio, some of the good will and pleasure afforded by the long and close friendship with the Whites.

"I hope the radio will bring your men a good deal of pleasure and enjoyment," Mrs. Smith told Colonel Meredith.

COUNTY CURFEW IS CONSIDERED

District Attorney George W. Neilson reported Friday establishment of a curfew for boys and girls 16 years old and younger, was under consideration as a means of curbing their late hour wanderings and conduct.

"This city and county is confronted with changing conditions which parents and citizens generally must realize," the district attorney said. "By taking early action, we may spare ourselves a lot of grief later. Parents should realize they must act, as there are not enough officers to look after their children."

LAUNDRY IN CAMP TO START AUG. 15; WORKERS NEEDED

Operation of the mammoth laundry at Camp White will commence about August 15, it was announced Saturday by the commanding officer.

Costing nearly a million dollars the main building and steam plant will have a capacity of 20,000 units daily.

One of the largest installations of its kind in the state, the laundry will employ a civilian personnel of 568 working two shifts.

Due to shortage of trained help, operations will be increased gradually, according to Major Lyman V. Williamson, laundry and reclamation officer of Camp White.

"We expect the laundry to be running at full capacity within a month of its opening," he said.

Of special interest to the enlisted personnel was Major Williamson's announcement that a monthly rate of \$1.50 will be charged for all personal laundry.

Major Williamson also revealed that female help is urgently needed and listed the following jobs available: Checkers, distributors, flatwork ironers, operators for shirt unit conveyor classifier, tying machine operator and miscellaneous laundry duties.

Applications for these positions will be taken after August 5 at the civil service department, 45 North Fir street.

LODGE AT CRATER TO DISCONTINUE SERVICE MONDAY

Crater Lake Lodge will discontinue operations after breakfast Monday, for the balance of the 1942 season, because of lack of business. Authority for the closing has just been granted by the Washington office of the National Park service. It was announced Saturday by Supt. E. P. Leavitt of Crater Lake Nat'l Park.

Bus service from Klamath Falls will also be discontinued Monday.

A limited and informal service will be provided for park visitors, however, by the rental of both standard and deluxe sleeping cabins at the rim of Crater Lake, and by a meal service to be provided by Mr. and Mrs. Robert P. Berry at Park headquarters, where they operate the government dining hall.

The services and facilities provided by the government will continue to be available, and the usual government staff will be on hand to inform and assist visitors in every practicable way. All roads and trails to points of interest will remain open, as well as the public campgrounds. Lectures will be given daily at the Sinnott Memorial.
