

FLIERS CHATTER AS THEY LOOSE BOMBS ON JAPS

Eyewitness Story Reveals
Yelps of Joy Given by
Yanks in Midway Battle.

With U. S. Fleet Off Midway Island, (Delayed) (AP)—This is designated as "Field day" in the battle of Midway. The tough part is over. The tension is gone, and everyone—despite the weariness of fighting strain—is smiling in the exultant mood of victory.

Our planes are out at dawn for the third day. At 9 a. m. they report a single enemy battleship, a cruiser and five destroyers steaming slowly at 10 knots 150 miles from our position. The battleship has been left behind by the Japs in their flight from a disastrous invasion attempt against Midway Island. We are ordered at 23 knots to "close on" the reported position of the enemy and the attack group is away at 10 a. m.

Three heavy bomb hits are made in this attack on the battleship, one of them "smack between the stacks." A fighter assault on the escorting destroyers is described as "very effective." One of the Jap cruisers is hit and immediately starts "an uncontrolled turn to the right."

An afternoon attack is pressed home with even more determination. Pilots on the fighter radio circuit keep up a running commentary of enthusiasm as they bore in. "Let's go boys!" begins the squadron leader. The air is full of jabbering:

"Open up! There's a couple of big ships—take any of them. This is Wally, entering dive now. . . . Let's get on him. What are you waiting for? Hold your horses, Wilbur. . . . This is Wally—commencing dive. That's what you said five minutes ago. What, another one? I'm after another one. . . . Let's do something, even if it's wrong. Okay, you big brave boys, we are all supposed to be together. Close up on me! Hey! Keep low. Righto. . . . Hey, any of you fellows got any bombs? There's a Mogi class cruiser in the rear."

"Oh baby! Did we put that damn can on fire. Looks like the battleship blew up, too. Get 'em again! They'll never get that fire out. Put 'em all smack on the bottom. . . . That one blew up too. Good hit! Good hit!"

" . . . Boy! I wish I had a camera along. Let's go back and make another dive, Wilbur. That scared the hell out of me. I thought we were not going to pull out. Atta boy, Eddie. This is Red. Oh boy! That was a beauty—looked like it went right down the stack."

"Yes, I'm all right. And wasn't that a beauty? These Japs are easy as shooting ducks in a rain barrel. Hey, Eddie, get out, damn it. . . . Tojo, you'll get your laundry this week. . . . Pappy? Are you okay? This is Dally. I don't have enough gas to stay around here. Okay, let's go home. . . . That battleship is stopped dead now. The heavy cruiser is burning fiercely, but still underway. . . . The battleship is asking for help to remove personnel. She just exploded once more."

13 DIE IN CRASH ON RAIL CROSSING

Crystal Springs, Miss., Aug. 6. (AP)—A collision between a bus carrying 52 persons and a fast passenger train brought death to 13 persons and injured more than 30 in the heart of this southern Mississippi city yesterday.

Efforts were continuing today to identify the bodies of two women taken to Jackson, Miss., funeral parlors after the crash. H. T. Morton of Crystal Springs, a bus passenger, said the driver stopped for a northbound freight train to clear the crossing.

"We drove onto the track right behind the freight and the southbound passenger train hit us," he said. Mrs. W. L. Dodds of Onyia, Miss., was killed when the heavy bus hurtled through the air and overturned on the sidewalk where she was standing trying to warn the driver of his danger.
