

KLAMATH WOMAN CLAIMS ESTATE TAKEN BY FRAUD

Niece of Dead Husband Got
Her to Sign Papers by
Misrepresentation, Claim.

San Francisco, Aug. 7.—(P)—Pearl Bisbee, 67, of Klamath Falls, Ore., has asked federal district court to require the return of real and personal property she contended was obtained from her through false pretenses by George E. Austin, niece of her deceased husband.

Mrs. Bisbee's suit, filed yesterday, set forth that while she was visiting the niece, at the latter's request, in the Austin home here last spring, she became ill and went to a hospital. She said the niece brought papers there for her to sign, representing that they would make money available for hospital expenses. Mrs. Bisbee signed without paying much attention to the nature of the papers, she said, only to learn later they were documents giving Mrs. Austin title to everything she owned.

Took Bank Account
The young woman went to Klamath Falls April 8, the petition stated, and removed from Mrs. Bisbee's bank account and safe deposit box \$3,150 in cash, \$5,000 worth of war bonds, the contract for a lot in Altamont acres, automobile ownership papers and jewelry valued at about \$2,000.

Later she returned to San Francisco and apparently induced Mrs. Bisbee to sign over to her the deed to the property, the bonds and the car, the petition said, although the widow still was very ill and had no recollection of her act.

Mrs. Bisbee said she was held a "virtual prisoner" by Mrs. Austin until July 26, but then managed to "smuggle out" a letter to another niece, Marie Coulter of Portland. The second niece arrived here July 29 and confronted Mrs. Austin with a demand for an explanation. The latter assertedly replied that she now owned all the property and didn't intend to give it up.

BRUSH BURNS IN DORRIS SECTION

STATE GUARD CAN ENLIST BOYS WITH PARENTS' CONSENT

Training Course Afforded by
Association With Veteran
Members of Company.

Under new state guard regulations, men between the ages of 17 and 21, can be enlisted in state guard units for a one-year period, providing they have their parents' or guardians' consent, Capt. James Grigsby, commanding Co. A, 1st infantry, the local guard unit, said today.

"Company A, with its present nucleus of trained men, a large percentage of whom are veterans of previous wars or campaigns, can now afford an excellent training course for younger men, not as yet of draft age, but who desire basic military training," said Capt. Grigsby.

Recent local guard promotions includes the promotion of Sergeant H. B. Wales to the acting first sergeant of company A. Wales served as a sergeant on the Mexican border and in France during World War I, has had naval service aboard the U. S. S. Prometheus, and as an "insurrecto" served as a subaltern during the Mexican revolution of 1911.

The Non-Commissioned Officers club of the company will honor non-commissioned officers of the military police corps, from Camp White, at a smoker Wednesday evening, August 12. Commissioned officers of both units will also be invited to attend the affair.

Man Who Preferred Death to Life Term Cool in Execution

San Quentin, Calif., Aug. 7.—(P)—Maurice L. Briggs, 28, of Los Angeles, was executed in the San Quentin poison gas chamber today for murder of Nat Ross, former film producer.

Briggs, who once told the board of prison terms and parole, that he would rather die than have his sentence commuted to life imprisonment, went to his death calmly.

"Everything is o.k., warden," he told Warden Clinton T. Duffy, just before he entered the death chamber. "I'm all right."

As the doors closed on the air-tight chamber, Briggs raised one hand in final salute to witnesses. The guards had failed to strap down one arm. The door was quickly opened and the hand secured.

At 10:02 generation of gas was started. At 10:11.5 Dr. C. D. Marple pronounced him dead.
