

RODEO ENTRANTS TO BE RECEIVED HERE THURSDAY

Mack Barbour of Klamath Falls will arrive in Medford Thursday morning to receive entries for the rodeo phase of the Jackson County Sheriff's posse's big rodeo and horse show, to be staged at the fairgrounds park at 8:30 next Saturday night. All cowboys desiring to enter the various events are asked to contact Barbour at the Hotel Allen.

Rodeo events will include wild bronc riding, calf roping, Brahma bull riding and team roping. Because most of the west's rodeo have been called off for the duration of the war, Barbour sends word that he expects many of the coast's top riders and ropers to enter the local show. A Camp White soldier, who claims to have ridden in Madison Square Garden, has signified his intention of competing according to a member of the posse committee in charge of the rodeo.

Many entries have already been received for the horse show, which will include a performance by the 91st Infantry Division's cavalry team, it was announced.

Open to the public are the western stock horse class, saddle horse events, and other classes. Reserve seats are on sale at Jarman's Penny-Wise drug store.

PRESSURE TESTS FOR PEARS SOON

The county agent's office today set up the pressure test machine for pears, an annual event that marks the preliminaries to the harvesting of the Bartlett crop.

Assistant County Agent Clifford B. Cordy said he expected the first pears to be brought in for pressure testing the end of the week. Some of the pears will be ready for picking by the first of next week, and picking will be in full swing by the first of next. The pears are developing satisfactorily under present weather conditions.

District Attorney George W. Neilson reported his office has been flooded the past few days with "defrauding an innkeeper" complaints from local landlords, as many workers employed on Camp White depart for other defense work.

She planned to present an American flag to each of them.

COTTAGE GROVE HAS FATAL FIRE

Cottage Grove, Aug. 11.—(P)—Cottage Grove's epidemic of suspicious fires reached serious proportions today when Stewart William King, 23, Cottage Grove, died at a Eugene hospital as the result of burns suffered early this morning in a motor cabin blaze, which the caretaker, J. D. Smith, said he was convinced "was deliberately set."

The blaze was the fourth suspicious fire in the Cottage Grove area in the last three weeks.

King, a resident of one of the three cabins destroyed with a loss of \$4,000, was severely burned above the waist, and died this morning in Eugene after being brought to a hospital here.

Smith, who operated the Moro lodge for his son-in-law, Elmer Linn, Portland, told how the flames spread so rapidly that occupants were hard pressed to escape. Two families were in the other building which burned but they managed to escape without injury.

COMMISSIONS TO PLAYBOYS RAPPED

Washington, Aug. 11.—(P)—Representative Coffee (D.-Wash.) suggested today disciplinary action against army and navy brass hats "who authorize commissions for 'playboy' sons of wealthy families."

"The most egregious example of blundering on the part of the brass hats," Coffee told the house, "is that of giving a commission to Horace Dodge, Jr. of Detroit."

This case, he added, was not an isolated one but was "typical of this reprehensible practice."

"What kind of morale can we build by giving honor to those among us who are not under serving?" Coffee asked.
