

PRICE CONTROL ACT EXPLAINED BY OPA LAWYER

Business Men Given Information on Regulation and Enforcement of Measure.

The purpose, regulations and enforcement of the Price Control Act of 1942 were explained last evening at the Episcopal Guild hall to a group of Medford business men by L. L. Ray, attorney for the Eugene district of the Office of Price Administration. Ray was introduced by Frank Hull, secretary of the chamber of commerce and at the close of his discussion answered questions pertinent to the subject.

Ray explained that the Eugene office services southern Oregon until further price offices are established. He said that the chamber of commerce is the dispenser of information and pamphlets from the price office headquarters and the rationing board, which should be known as the war price and rationing board, is handling rationing of items and will have other duties in the future as the situation develops.

Enforcement Essential
He urged business men to familiarize themselves with the regulations and said that enforcement of the act was essential to democracy as a means of curtailing inflation. The government is taking steps to educate consumers to the necessity of enforcement of the act and their part in carrying out the regulations. If the consumer refuses to pay more than the ceiling price the merchant will be forced to sell goods at this price, it was explained.

Among methods of enforcement Ray mentioned injunction, criminal penalties of two years to prison, \$5,000 fine or both; licensing, law of competition, patriotism and having manufacturers fix prices.

He urged posting of ceiling prices and explained the following points: preparation of cost of living commodities price list which should be filed with rationing board; that new cost of living articles added during previous months should be priced and filed with rationing board and personal list retained by merchant; a price list of all items on hand to be retained by merchants and not to sell at higher price than highest price given item during month of March.

Losses Adjusted
Methods of determining price for new cost of living commodities was discussed by Ray for the benefit of the merchants. He also stated that application for loss adjustment can be made through the regional administrator.

Hull announced at the opening of the meeting that plans will be made to hold a price clinic in this city in the near future with OPM and OPA officials present.

**PRICE LIST FILING
URGED BY BOARD**
The war price and rationing board in city hall asked today that merchants who have failed to file ceiling price lists, which were due July 1, file them immediately in order to avoid penalty. The board also requested merchants to have their supplemental price lists into the board by the tenth day of each month. This supplemental price list is composed of items which are added to stores during the previous month and upon which a ceiling price has been affixed.
