

\$1,300 INCREASE GRANTED BOWEN IN CAMP LAND CASE

Increasing by \$1,300 the government's offer of \$5,700 for 361 acres of land in the Camp White area formerly owned by Ray Bowen, a U. S. district court jury last night returned a verdict that \$7,000 was a just and fair compensation for the property. Bowen, through Attorney Edward C. Kelly, had asked \$13,000 for the land. The jury deliberated about two hours.

Another trial jury was today hearing arguments of counsel for the defense and the government in the condemnation suit of the government versus Ruth and J. P. Warren, who are asking \$22,000 for 240 acres in the cantonment area. The government has offered \$9,000. The jury viewed the property yesterday afternoon and was expected to have the case late this afternoon. Attorney Charles W. Reames is representing the Warrens, Bernard H. Ramsey and George Coddling the government.

Another jury was empaneled by Judge James Alger Fee this morning to hear the case of the government versus May E. Bowling, former owner of 70 acres in the camp area. The jurors are John L. Detwiler, Frank C. Albert, E. L. Scott, H. F. Platt, and Etha W. Wall, all of Medford; Clinton Price, Wolf Creek; August Erickson, Gold Hill; E. H. Harbeck and W. M. Richardson, both Grants Pass; Harry E. Harding, Trail; Frank Henspeter, Jacksonville and U. Grant Davis, Rogue River.

The defendant is represented by Attorney Kelly.

WESSELA LEAVING FOR AIR TRAINING

Conrad P. Wessela, associate forester of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, bureau of entomology, has been commissioned a first lieutenant in the U. S. army air forces and will leave here Sunday night for Miami Beach, Fla., to enter the Air Forces Officer Training school.

Lieutenant Wessela, for the past 10 years, has been in charge of blister rust control work in southern Oregon and northern California, with headquarters in Medford. He will be succeeded here by Douglas R. Miller, an associate forester from California, who has arrived to assume his new position.

Lieutenant Wessela is the fourth local man to receive a commission and attend the officer training school, the others being Captains Glenn L. Jackson, Floyd Hart and William F. Flunser.

MASQUERADER IS HELD IN SLAYINGS

Sparta, Wis., Sept. 10.—(U.P.)—Police at Elgin, Ill., informed authorities here today that they had arrested a man wearing an army shirt as a suspect in the brutal sex slaying of two Kenosha, Wis., welfare workers.

Elgin police said the suspect had difficulty explaining his whereabouts at the time the women, Miss Dorothy Baun, 32, and Miss Nell Pietrangeli, 25, were raped and slain in a se-

cluded wooded section near here. Authorities said the suspect had bought the shirt with a sergeant's chevrons at Kenosha. He was arrested last night for investigation of suspected impersonation and illegal use of an army uniform, according to Elgin police. The suspect apparently is not enlisted in the army, they said.

MILITIA READY FOR STRIKE DUTY

Springfield, Ill., Sept. 10.—(U.P.)—Gov. Dwight H. Green today ordered the mobilization of 1,000 officers and men of the Illinois reserve militia to stand by in their armories as a precautionary measure for possible strike duty at the Western Cartridge company plant at East Alton, Ill.

An announcement issued by the office of Adj. Gen. Leo M. Boyle of the Illinois state reserve militia said the troops would remain at their armories pending further developments.

Petrillo Forces Program Off Air

Cincinnati, O., Sept. 10.—(U.P.)—The Cincinnati Conservatory of Music has been forced off the air for the first time in nine years by a ruling of James Caesar Petrillo, American Federation of Musicians president. Conservatory officials said today.

Conservatory officials said Petrillo "has made another move toward dictatorship over the music in the United States" in forbidding the institution's weekly network broadcast on the grounds that non-union musicians were employed.

Quickie Walkouts Ended At 'Frisco

San Francisco, Sept. 10.—(U.P.)—An estimated 750 workers return to their jobs on five war projects today after "quickie" walkouts called in protest against working on a State holiday without time and one-half overtime pay.

The navy announced that the walkouts yesterday were inspired by a "puny minority of labor leaders" and served to delay work on the projects with out complete stoppage.

CONVICTS ESCAPE

Yakima, Wash., Sept. 10.—(U.P.)—Police today sought two Walla Walla, Wash., state penitentiary inmates who disappeared from the labor camp harvest work camp, 10 miles south of Yakima. State patrolmen said the men were Schuler H. Bucks, 42, and Milton Bergerson, 27. Both men have long criminal records, officers said.

EDUCATION BOARD OKES BUSINESS COURSE AT O. S. C.

Portland, Ore., Sept. 10.—(U.P.)—The State board of Higher Education announced today it had approved a "business technology" curriculum at Oregon State college after Acting President F. A. Gillfillan had criticized the proposed curriculum on grounds it was "unworkable and foredoomed to failure before it starts."

The vote was eight to one in favor of adoption of the new course, with R. W. Ruhl, member of the curriculum committee from Medford, voting no. President-Elect A. L. Strand, present at the meeting, made no comment.

The board in a meeting which lasted well into last night following a full day of committee sessions, also named P. M. Dunn of Utah State college as permanent dean for the school of forestry at Oregon State, considered numerous financial problems, and acted upon a long list of personnel changes.

Personnel changes included: Southern Oregon College of Education: Otto Wilda as assistant professor of English.
