

MONEY CACHE OF CHICAGO BANKER LOCATED BY F.B.I.

San Francisco, Sept. 12—(UP)—A cache of "at least \$50,000" more in cash, stocks, gold and jewelry belonging to Saverio Ariani, former Chicago bank president, has been seized, the federal bureau of investigation announced tonight.

Ariani, 64, his wife, Minnie, and their sons, Carlo, 33, and Romolo, 30, were arrested Sept. 4 at their San Francisco home on charges of concealing assets from a bankrupt estate. Agents obtained nearly \$50,000 in cash, stocks and other assets in a safe at the Ariani home when they were arrested.

Agents also found a receipt for a safe deposit box at the Hibbernia Savings and Loan Society in San Francisco, which Ariani admitted was his, although it was under a fictitious name. The box, opened today, yielded \$2000 in cash, \$715 in gold, \$10,000 in U. S. government bonds, \$2,000 in railway equipment and realty company bonds, four diamonds, two gold bracelets, two diamond lavaliers, three gold watches and 606 shares of miscellaneous stocks.

Ariani, president of the defunct Italian state bank at Chicago, disappeared in 1931 on eve of an audit by state bank examiners. An embezzlement indictment against him was dismissed later with leave to reinstate. An extradition hearing for removal of the family will be held Sept. 24.

The \$100,000 confiscated by the FBI will be held as evidence when the family faces trial with the possibility the trustee in bankruptcy may liquidate assets to pay off creditors.

Mrs. Ariani and the two sons were freed on bond, but Ariani remained in jail in lieu of \$25,000 bail.

BRITISH FLIERS MAKE LIFE EASY FOR YANKEE PALS

A Spitfire Base Somewhere in England, Sept. 12—(UP)—R. A. F. pilots have given up some of their best planes, fields and barracks to boost American morale by making United States fliers feel at home.

In some cases, British fliers are living in tents at half-finished fields, while Yanks occupy comfortable billets at their former bases. British officers have loaned out cooking staffs until such time as the Americans can organize their own facilities.

As a result, I found in a tour of American bases here, United States fliers have the greatest respect for their British comrades. The British, too, are most pleased with the Americans.

American fighter pilots, who from the "infantry of the air" in sky battles over the continent, are the prima donnas of the United States army air forces in Britain. Their every ache, pain, gripe, and sign of temper are noted carefully by doctors, intelligence officers and flight commanders.

A careful watch is kept on their morale, which may depend on any number of circumstances from the meals they eat to the entertainment that is provided during their off-hours.

American officers have told me—and I believe it from what I've seen here—that the morale of American pilots in Spitfire squadrons is the highest of any fliers anywhere.

Among factors which contribute to this are the confidence the American pilots have in their equipment and the respect they have for the men who command them.

Great competition exists between the various American Spitfire squadrons in Britain, and it is not unusual for fliers to hand around the field during their leisure hours for fear they may miss something. But the competitive spirit disappears once the men are in the air. For they know their lives depend on teamwork.

ADMITS REVENGE MURDER OF FOUR

Miami, Fla., Sept. 12—(UP)—Detective Captain E. W. Melchen said tonight that Vincent Christy, 36-year-old ex-convict of Los Angeles and San Francisco, had confessed to the murder of four Miamians on July 17.

Melchen said part of the confession was obtained while the suspect was being returned to Miami from Jacksonville, where he was arrested Wednesday, and that the full confession was signed here tonight at county jail in the presence of city and county officers.

State Attorney G. A. Worley said the murderer's motive was revenge.

Worley quoted Christy as saying he came to Miami from California, where he was released from prison five months ago for the express purpose of killing Irving Leopold, 37, Kosher market proprietor.

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ARKANSAS, UTAH GET COAST JAPS

San Francisco, Sept. 12—(UP)—A total of 4,400 Japanese at Tanforan and Stockton assembly centers will be moved to Arkansas and Utah relocation centers next week, it was announced tonight.

The army will move 4,200 San Francisco bay area Japanese from Tanforan assembly center to a relocation center 140 miles south of Salt Lake City, with the first contingent to leave Tuesday.

An advance party of 200 will leave the Stockton assembly center Sunday for a new relocation center in Desha county, Arkansas, in the Mississippi river delta, it was announced.

After the movements have been completed, 4,000 Japanese will remain at the Stockton camp and 3,500 at Tanforan.

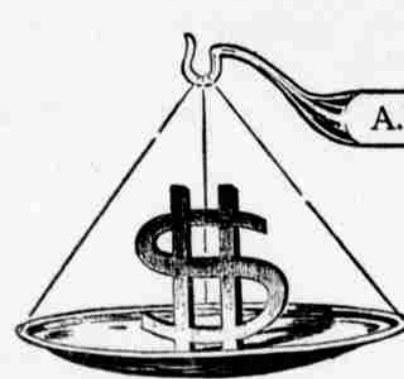
