TORPEDO HITS SHORE
A Gulf of St. Lawrence Port, Sept. 18.—(U.P.)—An enemy submarine fired a torpedo at a passing freighter. The torpedo missed and exploded against the rocky gulf headlands of a Quebec village, shattered 123 windows and slightly damaged a few buildings. Date of the attack was not disclosed.

TREASURY SHORT IN FIXING NEEDS SAYS SEN. GEORGE

Washington, Sept. 18.—(U.P.)—Chairman Walter F. George, D. Ga., of the senate finance committee today accused the treasury of being \$1,000,000,000 short in estimating the yield of the 1942 tax bill and 12 months too slow in admitting the need for compulsory savings.

Discussing revenue needs after Secretary of the Treasury Henry Morgenthau, Jr., had told a press conference that the senate version of the measure was "inadequate," George agreed that it did not raise as much as it should toward the financing of a war which will cost \$100,000,000,000 next year.

But George insisted that the bill would raise at least \$1,000,000,000 more than treasury estimates, which yesterday set the net total of the senate version at \$8,651,700,000 in new taxes.

An \$8,000,000,000 tax bill—added to the \$17,000,000,000 which tax laws already on the federal statute books are expected to produce this year—is just about all the taxpayer can stand, George said, especially when state taxes will take about \$10,000,000,000 more.

The only way to go further in curbing purchasing power, George said, is to enact a "stiff compulsory savings program." He blamed the treasury for the fact that no such program has been written into this tax bill.

reported that a strong British force had landed on the east coast, and that Tamatave, 150 miles northeast of Tananarive, the capital, fell this morning after a brief shelling.
