

INCREASE GRANTED IN STORAGE FEES ON APPLES, PEARS

Washington, Sept. 23.—(U.P.)—The office of price administration today authorized warehousemen and packers of apples and pears in Oregon and Washington to increase charges for the approaching harvesting season but specified that all increases will be subject to review later.

Pending review, warehouses will be permitted to collect an additional three cents a box for storage of apples and pears, other than cannery pears. For storage of cannery pears, on which rates usually are quoted on the tonnage basis, warehousemen may collect an additional \$1.50 per ton.

Major M. Morris, manager of the Medford Ice and Storage company, said no prior information had been received here concerning the authorizing by OPA of warehouses and storage plants to increase by three cents a box the storage charge on pears and apples. Morris said storage charges had been frozen as of March 1, 1942, and that information contained in the above dispatch was "news to me."

Because of increased labor and material costs, local warehousemen have for the past several weeks been attempting to obtain authorization from the OPA to increase their storage charges, he explained.

The newspaper, declaring "we know there are politicians who still cherish their old hopes," pointed out that British and American troops still awaited action while Adolf Hitler had thrown all of his resources and

those of his axis satellites into the Russian campaign.
