BROOKLYN, BEAR BACKS TIED FOR PRO SCORE LEAD

Pug Manders, Gary Famiglietti Both Have 18 Points Don Hutson Third.

Chicago, Sept. 30.—(U.P.)—Clarence (Pug) Manders, Brooklyn back who was the National Professional Football league's leading ground gainer last year, and Gary Famiglietti, second string fullback for the Chicago Bears, took the lead in the league's scoring department after the first full week-end of competition, official records showed today.

Manders crossed the Philadelphia Eagles' goal line three times Sunday while Famiglietti split the Green Bay Packers' line for 18 points. Don Hutson, packer end was third in scoring with two touchdowns and four conversions. Steve Juzwik, Washington, followed with 15 points.

Yardage Leaders

Gaylon Smith, Cleveland, led the ground gainers with 149 yards in 34 attempts, closely followed by Bill Dudley, Pittsburgh, who made 145 yards in 21 tries. Dante Magnani, Cleveland, was third with 125 in 19 attempts.

Tommy Thompson, Philadelphia, led the passers in yards gained, having completed tosses for a total of 465 yards in 55 attempts including five touchdown throws. Cecil Isbell completed 19 out of 31 and "Slingin'" Sammy Baugh, Washington, 22 out of 37.

HUSKY SOPH BIDS FOR REGULAR SPOT

Seattle, Sept. 30.—(U.P.)—The determined bid of "Buckshot" Fred Provo, sophomore, for a halfback starting berth and the return of fullback Neil Brooks from the ranks of the injured were the talk of the University of Washington locker room today.

Coach Ralph Welch declared Provo's slithery hipped running had won him the right to see "plenty of action" in Saturday's conference opener here against the Trojans although the experience of halfback Bob Erickson will retain his place as starter. Brooks is now completely recovered from his injuries and is slated to start at fullback.

Los Angeles, Sept. 30.—The Trojans of the University of Southern California leave town tonight for a two-weeks jaunt, during which they will meet the Washington Huskies at Seattle Saturday, and then go directly to Columbus, O., for their game a week later against Ohio State. Thirty-one men are slated to make the trip, with two additional men listed as possibilities. Jack Trout and Jim Stangeland may be left at home because of scholastic difficulties and injuries.

Los Angeles, Sept. 30.—Coach Babe Horrell's University of California at Los Angeles Bruins learned today they will have not only Frankie Albert to watch next Saturday, when they meet St. Mary's pre-flight cadets, but Bobby Grayson as well. As Horrell received word of Grayson's recovery from an injured ankle, he also was notified that Elmer McPherson, giant fullback transfer from Georgia Tech, will be eligible against the Cadets.

Berkeley, Cal.—(U.P.)—Coach Stub Allison of California today transferred shift Frank Porto from left half to fullback and said that sophomore Walt Rawn may start at quarterback against Oregon State at Corvallis Saturday.

The Bears went through a hard two-hour scrimmage last night and had another planned for today.
