tee last year, contending that reduction of temperatures would have a serious effect on health.

This much may be surely said:

The country, and particularly the womenfolk, will have to go into long underwear. This nation has been accustomed to a winter indoor temperature of around 70 to 72 degrees, and dressed accordingly.

European nations, particularly Britain and France, get along at lower temperatures, but they do so by using heavier clothing, and moving about more indoors.

Active children will no doubt suffer less than the aged and infirm. Office workers will have to adopt the practice of getting up and moving around frequently.

If these simple rules are adopted gladly by the people, and they have psychologically a sense of cooperation and a sense of confidence in the results, the effects will certainly be less serious than otherwise.

As a matter of fact, if the usual Washington course is followed, Mr. Henderson's shivering forecast probably will be moderated in administration. They always talk big and harsh here at the start, but somehow their programs always work out to be less terrifying than promised.

For an apt example, automobiles bearing "A" cards in the East are cluttering up the roads daily on their four gallons a week. Bootleg gas is available everywhere—in New York at five cents a gallon additional, and in Washington at ten cents a gallon extra.

THE first two steps taken by the government toward national gas rationing were diametrically opposed to the recommendations of the Baruch report.

\$703 SOUGHT IN THREE-WAY CRASH

The Agricultural Insurance company of Watertown, N. Y., and the Glen Falls Insurance company of Glen Falls, N. Y., filed suit in circuit court yesterday against Everett Faber, doing business as Faber's Farmer Supply company, for collection of amounts paid to holders of accident insurance policies, in the total sum of \$703.17.

The suit is based on a three-way auto accident on the Pa-

cific highway between this city and Phoenix on May 28, 1941. The complaint alleges a loaded truck belonging to Faber crashed into one car, resulting in three cars being damaged. The car procession had stopped to permit a truck to turn into the Bear Creek Orchards plant.

The complaint alleges negligence on the part of the Faber truck operator, in not having his truck under control, and travelling too fast.

The Agricultural Insurance company seeks \$155.55 for damages to the Paul Beare car and \$137.62 for damages to the John Doe Parker car of Yreka, Calif. The Glen Falls Insurance company seeks \$410 for damages to the auto of Melvin McClure.

The two companies issued accident insurance policies to the car owners.

TOMATO GROWERS RACE JACK FROST

Tomatoes of the valley are now ripening fast and growers handicapped by the labor lack, are striving to get them picked to beat the first fall frosts, due any day now, Assistant County Agent C. B. Cordy reported today. In the Ashland district business men of Ashland have

gone into the fields this week to assist in the picking and help the Bagley Canning company in filling its orders for tomatoes from the government.

Pear growers are now picking Bosc and Comice pears and also rushing the work as fast as the labor shortage and other conditions will permit. Most of the plants are working 10 to 12 hours daily and Sundays in an effort to get the pears in storage or packed.

JAP GENERALS KILLED

Chungking, Oct. 1.—(U.P.)—A military spokesman said today that eight Japanese lieutenant-generals and one admiral have been killed on the China front during the past five years. The latest general officer to die, the

spokesman said, was Lieut. Gen. Takashi Sakai, 54, killed in fighting near Lanki in Chekiang province.
