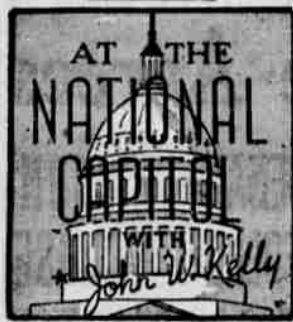


BUILDING PERMITS \$26,638 IN MONTH

Building permits in the community totalled \$26,638 for the month of September with three new residences included in the amount. This was nearly \$10,000 under the total for September, 1941, however, when building totalled \$36,885.

Building included: three new residences, \$5,000; 23 residences remodelled \$3,968; one remodelled business \$470 and addition to church, \$17,000. September, 1941 totals were: six new residences, \$20,750; two new businesses, \$13,250; eight remodelled residences, \$2,460, and three new garages, \$425.

"know how things are done in the army" and resent taking orders from individuals who have been in the army only a short time.

FRUIT packers and others in the Pacific northwest who expect to use tin cans for the duration would do well to contemplate figures recently issued by war production board. Normal peace-time needs of tin have ranged from 65,000 to 70,000 tons for all purposes. In 1941 the use rose to 110,000 tons, of which 98 per cent came from the south Pacific, mainly Federated Malay States. It is the plan of WPB, it is reported, to cut total consumption over the country this year to 62,000 tons and for 1943 to 48,000 tons. Such cuts cannot be attained without reduction in the use of tin cans.

Bolivia's production is being stepped up; just how much is not revealed. Tin from tin cans and tin plate scrap is expected to reach 5,000 tons—that is, provided housewives, hotels and restaurants make serious effort to save the usual waste. Not more than 1,000 tons of tin are secured from all other regions or sources than those mentioned, including Alaska, the United States and Mexico.

It is known that Bolivia has large deposits of tin ore, a heavy percentage of which is lower than normal commercial grades. Early steps to get this ore produced first encountered one of those usually restrictive cartels. Then ownership and operating conditions created problems causing further delay. After that, the only excuse for further delay and inaction was found in the ponderous and inefficient machinery of Reconstruction Finance, National Advisory Committee, office of production management, and now war production board. These agencies have often been likened to "the mills of the gods," which grind slowly but exceedingly small. Many efforts by Americans to produce tin in other fields have been so ground by the Washington "mill."

ONE result of the shortage of tin, unless a cheap and satisfactory substitute can be found, will be increased use of frozen foods. Already the war is bringing frozen foods into camps, hospitals and military institutions in ever increasing quantity. The problem of keeping butter in the tropics, however, is about to be solved from an entirely different angle. Dr. George E. Holm, in charge of bureau of dairy industry fat-spoilage research, has perfected a method of preparing pure butter-fat and packaging it so that it will keep almost indefinitely under extreme conditions. Combining this product with skim milk powder and a little cold water makes good butter, it is reported. This will no doubt be good news to some of the soldiers stationed in the far south.
