CHURCHES JOIN IN OBSERVANCE LORD'S SUPPER

Churches of all denominations will observe the communion of the Lord's Supper in their respective places of worship next Sunday as a part of the World Wide Communion Sunday observance sponsored by the World Council of Churches.

This is probably the most comprehensive and significant act of cooperation participated in by the various Catholic and Protestant communions around the world, it was pointed out today by the Medford Ministerial Association. It is all the more meaningful this year since Christians from all nations, many of which are at war with each other, will observe this day of prayer and communion.

The Ministerial association urged all churches of Medford and the chapel services at Camp White to join in the World Wide day of communion and fellowship. "This do in remembrance of Me," said Jesus of Nazareth 19 centuries ago as he instituted the

observance of the Lord's Supper. In like manner he said "Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world."

"Certainly our times urge all men to remember Him and to be drawn into the fellowship of his mystical presence. Next Sunday should be a great day for all of the churches of our community as they gather around the communion tables of their respective churches."

All church members should make an especial effort to be present at their services of worship. Those members of the various communions in other communities are invited to present themselves at the service of the church of their choice in our city or at the chapel services at Camp White. All services will be enriched for this special occasion, the ministers' statement concluded.
