

REGISTRATION OF 18-YEAR-OLDS TO START ON DEC. 11

Selective Service Boards of
Jackson County Give De-
tailed Schedule.

The Jackson County Selective Service boards announced Saturday that in compliance with the proclamation by the president of the United States, registration of 18-year-old male citizens would take place on the following dates:

Those who were born on or after July 1, 1924, but not after August 31, 1924, shall be registered on any day during the week December 11 to 17 in the Selective Service offices in the City Hall in Medford. Special registration locations will be established throughout the county at Prospect, Trail, Butte Falls, Eagle Point, Ashland, Talent, Rogue River, Gold Hill and Ruch on December 15 only, for convenience of those born between the dates mentioned above and who reside near those towns.

Six Days Given
The spokesman for the Jackson county boards particularly emphasized that the registrants who came under this category may register any time between 9 a. m. and 5 p. m. any day, December 11 to 17, at the Selective Service offices in the City Hall, and on Tuesday, December 15, the Selective Service board offices will remain open until 7 p. m.

Male citizens in Jackson county born after September 1, 1924, but not after October 31, 1924, will be registered under the same program during the week of December 18 to 24 at the Selective Service offices in the city hall and registration locations in the county will be open Tuesday, December 22 only.

Male citizens born after November 1, 1924, but not after December 31, 1924, will be registered during the week December 26 to 31 at the Selective Service offices and in the other registration locations in the county on Tuesday, December 29. Any male citizens born after January 1, 1925, will be registered on the day they attain the eighteenth anniversary of the day of their birth, at the Selective Serv-

ice offices of Jackson county in the Medford City Hall. If such anniversary falls on a holiday or Sunday the registration will be on the day following.

Who Must Register
Persons required to register are those listed below by the proclamation of the president of the United States directing the sixth registration:

"Every male citizen of the state of Oregon, and every other male person residing in the state of Oregon, other than persons excepted by section 5 (a) of the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940, as amended, or by section 208 of the Coast Guard Auxiliary and Reserve Act of 1941, is required to and shall during the time or on the day fixed herein for his registration present himself for and submit to registration before a duly designated registration official or selective service local board having jurisdiction in the area in which he has his permanent home or in which he may happen to be during that time or on that day if such male citizen or other male person has not heretofore been registered under the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940, as amended, and the regulations prescribed thereunder.

"The duty of any person to present himself for and submit to registration in accordance with any previous proclamation issued under said act shall not be affected by this proclamation.

"A person subject to registration may be registered after the

time or day fixed for his registration in case he is prevented from registering during that time or on that day by circumstances beyond his control. If he is unable to present himself for and submit to registration during the time or on the day fixed for his registration, he shall do so as soon as possible after the cause for such inability ceases to exist."

MILLARD FORMING GIRLS' ORCHESTRA

Plans are being completed for organization of an all-girl orchestra, to include girls of high school age and over, according to Dr. Dell E. Millard, who is to be director and manager. Dr. Millard has taught band and orchestra musicians in high schools of the valley for the past five years and formerly taught college bands and orchestras and municipal bands and orchestras.

Dr. Millard cited the purposes of the new organization as twofold: Formation of a permanent organization through which girl

musicians may receive free musical training, and continue musical education after high school, and, second, to provide an organization through which musicians may have opportunity to play in concerts, entertainments in the community and at Camp White, and also looking forward to radio work and the making of recordings.

All girl musicians of southern Oregon are invited by Dr. Millard to apply for membership in the orchestra. Vocalists will be given special consideration. No membership fees will be charged. Dr. Millard asks that those interested write or telephone him at his home, 714 South Oakdale avenue.
