

MISSOURI TRIMS IOWA NAVY TEAM IN SURPRISE WIN

Kansas City, Mo., Dec. 5.—(U.P.)—It took Missouri's Golden Tigers, led by the ace Big Six scorer, Ramblin' Robert Steuber, just 80 seconds today to win an upset victory over the high-ranking Iowa navy pre-flight team, 7 to 0.

Steuber, a senior back and a naval reservist, gave the navy the secret of victory as he took a lateral from Ervin Pitts on the second play of the game, skirted his own left end and cut down the sidelines.

As Seahawk secondary men hemmed him against the sidelines, the agile Steuber, third highest scorer in the nation, cut back against the field and passed the final stripe untouched. He kicked the extra point to boost his season's scoring total to 121.

More than 7,600 spectators, shivering in the inclement weather which made the field impossible for fast foot-work, serial assaults and punting, saw Steuber play his final game, again the spark of the Missouri attack as he has been throughout the season as Missouri won its second consecutive Big Six championship.

Bouncing back after the 58-yard run by Steuber, the Seahawks marched from their own 30 to the Tiger 12. There the

defense stiffened, tossed the Cadets back to their 18. James Austin ended the threat by snaring a Cadet pass on the 22.

In the second quarter, the Tigers, again with Steuber leading the offensive, marched to the 4-yard line. Steuber started it by snaring an Iowa pass on the Cadet 45, running it to the 33.

After Bert Ekern made eight, Steuber twice hit off his own right tackle on the razzle-dazzle T-offensive to move to the 4. But a fumble by Jimmy Austin ended the threat.

Throughout the remainder of the game, the slippery pigskin moved back and forth in the mid-field sector, neither team able to carry a sustained assault.

HAL ADAMS NOW IN NAVY SCHOOL

Harold Richard (Hal) Adams, 17, star Medford high school football player, enlisted in the U. S. navy the past week and is now stationed at the naval training school at Farragut, Idaho.

Although nobody has yet clinched a regular position on Medford high's 1942-43 basketball team, Coach Lorne Arnold has tentatively settled on four of the first five posts after sending the cagers through their first week of practice.

Captain Don Fawcett, Darrell Monteith, Dale Niedermeyer and Alan Weir, all lettermen, have just about sewed up starting berths, he said, while the fifth position was still "wide open." Battling for this spot are Bill Bayliss, Gil Tummy, Jack Kresse, and Herb Edwards, among others.

Arnold said the biggest problem seemed to be at the guard posts. He wants to shift Fawcett, a guard last season, to forward to work with Monteith, and is searching for another guard to team with Weir. Niedermeyer is at center.

The squad of 60 men was cut Friday to 34, with 16 on the varsity and 18 on the sophomore roster. The sophs are being coached by Alex McDonald.

The Tigers open the season here the night of Dec. 18 against the Weir, (Calif.) Cougars, and play a return engagement with the Californians at Weir Dec. 30. The district 4 campaign opens Jan. 8 and 9, with the locals traveling to Roseburg.

RICE WINS FROM METHODISTS, 13-7

Houston, Tex., Dec. 5.—(U.P.)—Rice Institute grabbed an early lead today behind the stellar passing and running of Eikenberg and Williams to defeat Southern Methodist university, 13 to 7, in the final football game of the season for both teams.

The victory gave Rice undisputed claim on second place behind the Southwest conference champion, University of Texas. It was a grand finale for Rice, whose strong defense had not allowed a conference score in the three games before today.

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MISSISSIPPI ACE BEATS SAN FRAN.

Memphis, Tenn., Dec. 5.—(U.P.)—Bondy Black, Mississippi State's spectacular tailback who raced 82 yards to score against San Francisco last year, nearly duplicated his feat here today when he ran 72 yards for a touchdown to defeat the vaillant Dons 19-7.

Black, All-Southeastern back for two years, ended his college football career by leading the attack against a stubborn San Francisco eleven on a soggy field before a disappointing crowd of 200.

Mississippi State scored five minutes in the opening period after Black, Lamar Blount, and Charlie Yancey pushed the Don line back to the 46-yard stripe. Working to the Frisco five-yard line for a first down, Black gave the ball to Blount on a reverse who scored standing. Ted Schuff's placement was blocked.

SALESMEN TO GET GASOLINE BOOST

Washington, Dec. 5.—(U.P.)—Price Administrator Leon Henderson today authorized additional gasoline rations for a large part of the nation's 700,000 traveling salesmen to allow them a maximum driving distance of 8,600 miles a year.

Salesmen who qualify under the revised plan will have their

400-odd mile monthly occupational driving ration increased up to a maximum of 716 miles a month.

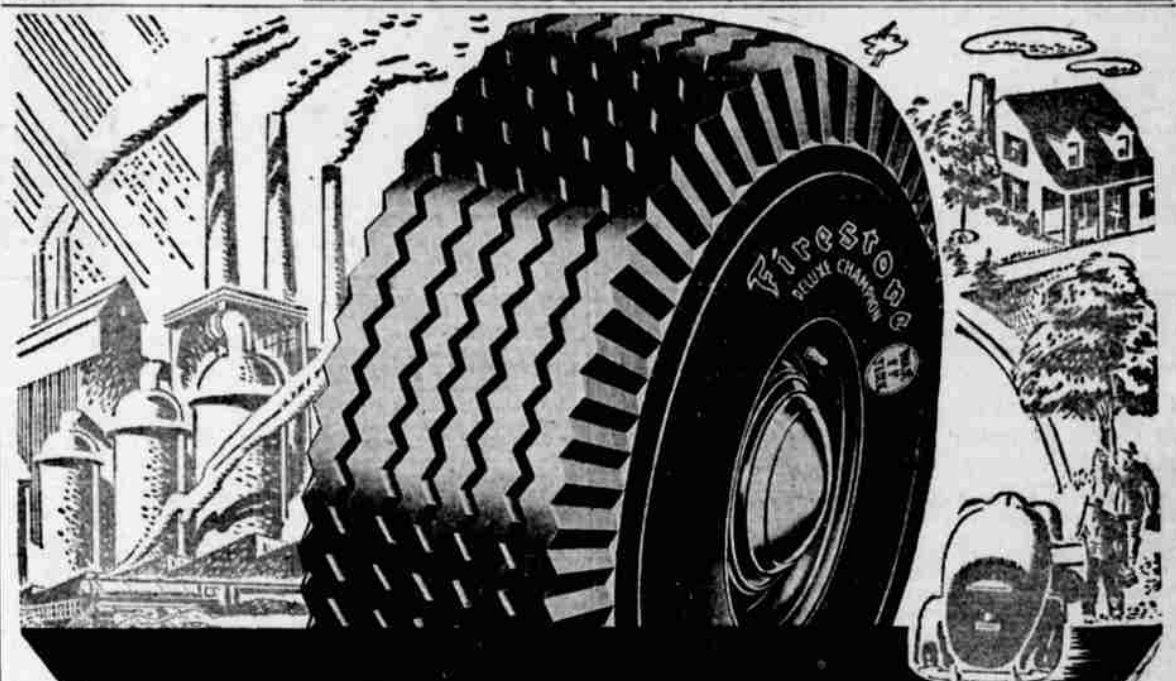
Details of the plan's operation are not yet completed, but OPA said that, roughly, salesmen eligible for the increased allowance must be engaged fulltime in the sale of necessary productive equipment for farms, factories, mines, oil wells, lumber camps or similar establishments, or of essential food, shelter, fuel, clothing or medical supplies.

Local boards will begin receiving applications from salesmen after Jan. 1, OPA said.
