DECEMBER RAINS UNDER ESTIMATE

If you think that December has been a wet month so far you're mistaken, according to figures from the weather bureau who says that to date only 1.06 inches of rain has fallen this month as compared to 3.17 inches for the first eight days of December, 1941.

On Dec. 2, 1941, Medford was drenched with a total of 2.99 inches. It snowed .9 inches on Dec. 16 and several days during the last of the month a trace of snow was recorded. The weather bureau observers stated that any number of years in the past have been wetter than this month to date.

Thus far during the season which began September, according to weather statistics, precipitation has totalled 10.66 which is 5.43 inches above normal. Temperatures have been average for the month.

WPA WITHDRAWAL PERILS PROGRAM FOR RECREATION

Withdrawal of WPA funds from communities by the federal government may have a saddening effect on the local community according to recreation leaders where the Medford Nursery school and the Outpost for men in the armed forces are aided by this grant from the government. It is hoped that funds will be available through the Federal Security agency to continue these needed and worthwhile projects. Recreational facilities are especially needed at this time in Medford and vicinity, recreation leaders pointed out. The need of a recreational coordinator is especially seen in the community to aid the churches, lodges and granges in their task of offering worthwhile entertainment to the soldiers now stationed at Camp White, and to parents engaged in defense activities and employment who have young children of nursery school age.
