Washington, Dec. 16—(U.P.)—The supreme court is expected to hear argument today in a suit attacking constitutionality of the San Francisco milk ordinance. The suit was brought by the Natural Milk Producers association, a cooperative association of raw milk producers.

CAMERA FILM CUT ORDERED BY WPB

Washington, Dec. 16—(U.P.)—Severe reductions in the manufacture of camera film for civilian use were ordered today by the War Production Board, which said production facilities are strained to the limit to meet military requirements.

Reductions were:
Still and motion picture camera film for amateur use—50 per cent below 1941 output.

35-millimeter film for all uses—24 per cent below 1941.

Other film for professional use—24 per cent below 1941.

December production quota for amateur still and motion picture film—five per cent of 1941 output.

December production quota for professional use—seven per cent of 1941 output.

HOBBS SENTENCED ON MORALS COUNT

Frank Hobbs, 66, a carpenter, entered a plea of guilty to contributing to the delinquency of a minor girl, and was sentenced to serve an indeterminate sentence not to exceed two years in state prison by Circuit Judge H. K. Hanna yesterday.

Hobbs was arrested Monday night and made a signed statement, according to the authorities. The girl in the case was paroled recently from a state institution.

TRAFFIC BATTERS TABLE ROCK ROAD

The Table Rock road between the Camp White entrance and this city is not standing up well under the heavy traffic, County Engineer Paul B. Rynning reported today. The remainder of the road to Bybee, built this year, is also showing the strain of travel. The county engineer said the government would be asked to allocate funds for heavy oiling of the road next year. No heavy oil was applied this year, due to shortage. The road was not completely finished last fall.

Roads in general throughout the county suffered from the November rains, and maintenance crews and graders are now repairing them. The county engineer said a few days of sunshine were needed to aid the workers, and put the roads in good shape for winter use.

EMPLOYEE IDEAS BRING \$53,000

Chicago—(U.P.)—According to the National Association of Suggestion Systems, the average war worker is good for three practical ideas to improve production.

E. S. Taylor, president of the

association and director of the suggestion system of the Pullman Co., said that some employees have turned in enough prize-winning suggestions to pay for their homes.

"In the first 18 months of

operation of the Pullman suggestion system," Taylor said, "employees sent in 42,000 suggestions for improvement to operations and practices. Of this total the company adopted 4,600, paying the 2,600 suggesters \$53,000."

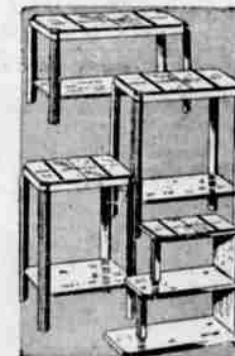

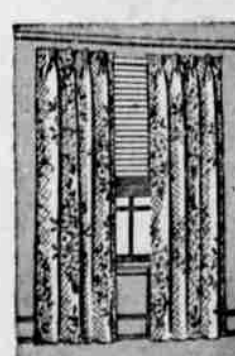
