He attended Stanford university and then began his leadership in Scouting as a Scoutmaster and Merit badge counselor in Portland from 1929 to 1933, while in business in that city. He entered Scouting professionally in 1934 as field executive in Wichita, Kan., where he remained until 1937. From 1937 to 1940 Warner was field executive of the Detroit area council, Detroit, Mich., following which he became assistant executive in the Seattle area council. "We are most fortunate in securing Warner as our executive," said Schade. "His wide experience both in and out of Scouting will prove invaluable. Our executive board is confident that we shall continue to extend the influence of the Scout program to more and more boys in the three counties served by the Crater Lake area council. We hope to have Mr. Warner with us on or about the first of January, and shortly thereafter he and Arnold Green, our assistant executive, will go into all the districts so that he may become acquainted with Scout leaders and friends of Scouting."

Genius Found Short In Figuring Taxes

That, at least, is the contention of the collector of internal revenue, who said today that Welles was \$31,385 short in figuring up his 1941 income tax.
