OFFICERS' HOOTCH TO BE RETURNED

Oklahoma City, Dec. 25—(U.P.)—Federal District Judge Edgar S. Vaughn today ruled in favor of the Fort Sill officers mess regarding 225 cases of whisky seized in an Oklahoma City raid several weeks ago.
Vaughn decided in favor of the Yellow Transit company, which was hauling the liquor through Oklahoma City when state officers made the raid.
Vaughn will issue an order to return the whisky for delivery to Fort Sill.
He held that the shipment was in interstate commerce and therefore not subject to Oklahoma regulations until delivered at its destination.
The liquor was seized while in a trailer at the company's Oklahoma City docks. It had been shipped from East St. Louis, Ill.
