GERMANS IN U.S. DENOUNCE NAZIS

New York, Dec. 28 — (U.P.) — The anti-Nazi organization, loyal Americans of German descent, denounced Nazi oppression of Jews and "other innocent peoples" today and called on the German people to overthrow the Hitler regime.

In full-page newspaper advertisements it urged Germans "to overthrow a regime which is the infamy of German history," warning that "Hitler is creating a deep loathing of all things German in the heart of mankind."

The "Christmas Declaration" advised Americans of German descent to "raise our voices in denunciation of the Hitler policy of cold-blooded extermination of the Jews in Europe and against the barbarism committed by the Nazis against all other innocent peoples under their sway."

The 50 signers included: Henry Seidel Canby, editor of the Saturday Review of Literature; Walter Damrosch, composer and conductor; Dr. Charles E. Diehl, president, Southwestern College, Memphis, Tenn.; Dean Christian Gauss of Princeton University; George Herman (Babe) Ruth, former outfielder of the New York Yankees.
