Republican Victory Will Hurt Workers Says Catholic Head

Cleveland, Dec. 30.—(U.P.)—Magr. John A. Ryan, director of the department of social action of the National Catholic Welfare Conference of Washington, declared here today that a Republican victory in 1944 and a subsequent coalition with Democratic reactionaries would bring a "disastrous decline" for wage earners.

Speaking before the convention of the American Catholic Sociological Society, Magr. Ryan declared that the "champions of free enterprise" must be stopped from gaining control of a reconstructed capitalist order after the war.

"So long, however, as the present occupant of the White House remains there, no fears need be entertained for the cause of labor, or the cause of social justice," he declared.

He attacked the national association of manufacturers, metropolitan newspapers, the most powerful of the farm organizations and the reactionary majority of the recently elected congress as "the authentic bourgeois."

CHICAGO PAPERS INCREASE PRICE

Chicago, Dec. 30.—(U.P.)—Two Chicago afternoon newspapers, the Daily News and Herald American, announced today an increase from three to four cents in price of their daily papers.

The Daily News increase will go into effect Dec. 31 and the Herald American on Jan. 4. Both papers attributed the increase to mounting war costs and said it was necessary to maintain editorial standards.

The Chicago Times will continue to charge three cents for its daily edition. It was increased from two cents last March. The two morning Chicago newspapers, the Sun and the Tribune, both announced last week an increase from two to three cents in the price of week-day papers.
