

TELEPHONE EARNINGS SHOW SLIGHT BOOST

N. R. Fowley, president of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company, in commenting on the company's affairs in connection with the release of dividend checks for the third quarter, today stated:

"The third quarter preliminary earnings statement indicates earnings of \$1.78 per common share, only a slight improvement over the \$1.69 per common share earned in the second quarter and compares with the \$1.56 per common share earned in the third quarter of last year. The earnings statement reflects federal taxes only at the 1942 rates and likewise does not reflect any portion of wage increases approximating \$6,000,000 annually which are now under negotiation with the unions, and which if accepted will require the approval of the War Labor board."
