

RECREATION PHASE TO RECEIVE AID OF COMMUNITY CHEST

Variety Of Projects In Jackson County For Service Men And Civilian Morale.

A variety of projects have been sponsored by the Jackson County Recreation committee, entered on the budget of the Medford Community Chest for this coming year as a participating agency, since organization of the committee more than two years ago. Among the projects have been the Medford Nursery school, the MarkKade, the Outpost, Wing In, a recreation center for negro troops and several smaller projects. Currently the committee is sponsoring an investigation of "teen age recreation problems in Medford."

It is pointed out by chest officials that since the activities of the committee are so diverse, and since some projects need more financial assistance than others, funds allocated from the chest will not be earmarked.

Three Main Projects

Three largest projects sponsored by the committee last year were the Outpost, the MarkKade and the Wing In. Newest of these is the MarkKade, recreation center for enlisted servicemen and wives housed in the new wing of St. Mark's Episcopal church on North Oakdale Ave. Attendance at the center has averaged nearly 2,000 men a month for the three months of operation, according to the director, Mrs. Lillian Hinman. The center is equipped with all manner of recreational facilities and in addition dances are given twice a week and informal musical events are planned. A group

of 40 women serve as volunteer senior hostesses and 40 young women, known as Markettes, attend dances and otherwise assist with the program. Wives are assisted with housing problems and in finding employment.

The Outpost has served a double purpose since its establishment, being used as a recreation center for enlisted men until opening of the new USO on Riverside avenue. Since that time, June, the Outpost has been converted to the use of junior army officers, army nurses, WAC officers and officers' wives.

Outpost Popular

The Outpost plans dances and musicals, a bridge luncheon is given one afternoon a week, a lending library is maintained and there is a fine collection of records. The men use the center as a place to meet friends and dates, read, write letters, press clothes and in a variety of other manners while the wives use the center for Red Cross meetings, as an information bureau, a housing bureau and a general center for social activities. An average of 75 officers, 35 wives and 30 civilians visit the club daily, according to the director, Mrs. I. E. Schuler.

One of the oldest projects of the committee is the airport canteen, Wing In, which has been in operation about two years and has now a reputation among hundreds of army aviators who write to praise the excellent food and cheerful hospitality. The little canteen is run for the benefit of military personnel only, both enlisted men and officers, and food is served at cost. Volunteer help keeps the canteen in operation from 10 a. m. until 10 p. m. daily and hundreds of meals are served each week. Since airports are traditionally known among aviators as having poor eating facilities, Jackson county's Wing In is considered unique.

Nursery Started

The Medford nursery school, at first sponsored by the committee, is now operated independently with funds received under the Lanham Act.

GIRL SENTENCED FOR MARRYING 7

Phoenix, Ariz., Oct. 13.—(U.P.)—Too much marrying and not enough divorce will result in 34-year-old Vivian Eggers spending the next 18 months pondering her complicated marital adventures in prison.

The "girl who tried to marry the army"—as one federal judge described her—received that sentence from Judge David W. Ling in U. S. district court yesterday, plus a five-year suspended term, on the specific charge of accepting family allowance checks as the wife of Pvt. George Campbell.

The bad part of the whole thing, the government said, was that Campbell was only one of seven soldiers she had married without the formality of divorcing any of them.

CARNEGIE STEEL SUED BY U. S. ON FAULTY PLATES

Pittsburgh, Oct. 13.—(U.P.)—The federal government today brought suit in federal court to recover damages from the Carnegie-Illinois Steel Corp., the U. S. Steel Export Co., and nine individuals for alleged sub-standard steel plates furnished to the government.

In filing the civil suit, U. S. District Attorney Charles F. Uhl seeks \$2,000 "from each of the defendants for each of the acts and transactions described which may be found by this (federal) court to constitute a violation, and, in addition, double the amount of damages which the court finds the U. S. has sustained by reason of the doing or committing of such acts."

The government's action followed a federal grand jury probe here this summer when Carnegie-Illinois, a U. S. Steel Corp. subsidiary, and an employee, Lawrence S. Dahl, general superintendent at the corporation's Irwin works, were indicted on charges of conspiring to conceal and destroy facts concerning tests of plates shipped to the navy, maritime commission and treasury for lend-lease.

EX-MEDFORD BOY BOMBED PLOESTI

Richard G. Miller, former Medford high school basketball player, is now a bombardier captain in north Africa, and took part in the recent bombing of the Ploesti oilfields in Rumania, one of the Axis sources of oil supply.

He is one of the four sons of Mr. and Mrs. H. H. Mansfield, former local residents. Several years ago the family moved to Mansfield, Ohio, where they have since resided. Copies of Ohio papers containing an account of Bombardier Captain Miller's achievement have been received by Mrs. C. W. Palm. The father was an insurance agent, and well known here.

Wife Was Sorry When She Trod On Mate's Face

St. Paul, Oct. 13.—(U.P.)—Mrs. Carol B. Baker, Minneapolis, admitted she sometimes had stepped on her husband's face with high-heeled shoes but she said she "always cried bitterly later in repentance."
