

ITALIAN RE-ENTRY GIVES ALLIES BIG FLEET INCREASE

One of Chief Values of Contribution Seen in Immediate Use of Over 100 Ships

One of the chief values to the Allies of Italy's declaration of war against her former Axis partner was seen today as the immediate and full use of the Italian fleet.

Though more than 100 Italian warships, ranging from battleships to torpedo boats, had surrendered to the Allies, they could not be used until Allied seamen had been trained to fight them, a task that would have taken months.

Potentially Strong

But with Italy re-entering the war on the Allied side, the ships can now be fought by their Italian crews. Though the Italian navy was of little use to the Germans when Italy was their ally, it is potentially a powerful fighting force and with units of the American and British navy acting as a stiffening influence, could be of tremendous value in the conquest of the eastern Mediterranean islands held by the Nazis and in any invasion of Greece and the Balkans.

What Italy could contribute to the war against Germany in the way of ground and air forces was known only to the Allied high command, but it was believed that a large part of the Italian army was in the part of Italy occupied by Germany and hence lost to the Allies. The air force was believed to have been completely shattered before Italy surrendered.

OREGON TEACHER SHORTAGE SERIOUS

Salem, Ore., Oct. 14.—(U.P.)—D. A. Emerson of the state department of education today reported a teacher shortage in Oregon elementary and high schools was approximately 5 per cent, based on a normal demand of 8,000.

He said the most serious shortage is in grade schools and in specialized fields in the high schools. A few school districts decided to close for the 1943-44 school year because of the teacher shortage, he explained.

More than 500 teachers are at work in Oregon class rooms under emergency permits authorized by the 1943 legislature, which materially reduced teaching prerequisites.

POTTER PALMER WILLS \$3,000,000 TO FAMILY

Chicago, Oct. 14.—(U.P.)—The will of Potter Palmer II, who died Sept. 3 at Santa Barbara, Cal., was filed in probate court today, leaving a \$3,000,000 estate to his wife and children. The will revealed that Palmer died owning \$2,500,000 in personal property and \$500,000 in real estate. The estate was left in trust with half the income going to Mrs. Palmer and half to the children for the duration of their lives.

At one time the Palmer corporation owned considerable property in the Rogue River valley, including both the Modoc and Klamath orchards. These were disposed of in recent years, however, and it is understood that the Palmers no longer have any real estate in this district.

ANOTHER AIR FACILITY FOR LOS ANGELES CO.

Washington, Oct. 14.—(U.P.)—The War department today announced authorization for construction of an air forces installation in Los Angeles county, Calif., costing over \$1,000,000.
