The grand jury to be drawn at opening of the October term of circuit court next Monday at 10 a. m. will investigate fatal accidents occurring in this county in the past three months. District Attorney George W. Neilson reports. The list includes the recent East Main street crash, resulting in the death of one Mexican national and injury to 14 fellow-countrymen; the auto plunge in the Siskiyou, in which three were killed and the fatal hunting accident this fall in the Butler Peak district.

The new grand jury will consist of the first seven names drawn from the jury box at opening of court.

The criminal calendar for the new term will be light. A large percentage of defendants accused of felonies have entered pleas of guilty and received sentences. A number of pending civil actions, however, are scheduled for trial.

## Home Coming Day Stated Sunday at Nazarene Church
