

RATION REGISTRY DATES AND TIME GIVEN FOR COUNTY

Medford Registration Slated
Thursday, Friday; Times,
Dates Differ in Towns.

Dates and times for distribution of ration book No. 4 through schools of Jackson county were announced Saturday by County School Superintendent C. R. Bowman. The distribution is fixed by the government as beginning not earlier than October 26 and extending not later than October 30, according to the superintendent, who pointed out, however, that the various issuing centers may use a few number of days and also have authority to fix the hours. Those registering must bring book No. 3 in order to receive the new book. Schedules as completed up to Saturday are given below:

Thursday and Friday, from 2 p. m. to 8 p. m.: Phoenix, Rogue River, Central Point, Oak Grove, Howard, Gold Hill, Jacksonville, Talent, Ruth.

Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 2 p. m. to 8 p. m.: Eagle Point, Prospect.

Thursday and Friday, 1 p. m. to 9 p. m.: Sams Valley.

Thursday, 12:30 to 8:30 p. m., and Friday, 9 a. m. to 8:30 p. m.: Medford.

Wednesday and Thursday, 4 p. m. to 7 p. m., and Friday, 3 p. m. to 6 p. m.: Pinehurst.

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, 3 p. m. to 8:30 p. m., Applegate.

Later announcement will carry the time for Butte Falls. Complete details of arrangement for issuing book 4 in Medford will be announced Monday.
