WILLKIE CHARGES PRESIDENT IS TOO FOND OF POWER

Mismanagement Prevails Throughout Government Which May Prolong War.

New York, Oct. 25.—(U.P.)—Wendell L. Willkie charged today that "because the president is so fond of power and loath to disburse it," mismanagement prevails throughout the government which may prolong the war and lose the peace.

Writing in the November issue of Reader's Digest, Willkie called for a change in White House tactics and urged that the number of men who report directly to the president be limited and their responsibilities and authority clearly defined.

Coordination Lack
Willkie said that the Roosevelt administration had necessarily multiplied the number of its agencies but failed to coordinate them, and added:
"There is only one person who can correct this government mismanagement. That person is the president himself. Of all that is wrong with the president's administration, there is nothing that better administration by the president could not remedy."
To illustrate his allegations of bad management Willkie asserted that there are 49 federal corporations and credit agencies with a say in lending government funds; more than 10 agencies responsible for sugar control, and five agencies created to handle the need for day nurseries.

What Country Wants
What the country wants in a president, Willkie said, is a man "who, eschewing petty occupations and the lure of little powers, would stand forth to speak and act not only from his heart to the people, but for the people out of what is in their hearts."
Instead, he said, the president's desk is cluttered and his mind distracted "by his concern with the wheels within wheels, the foremen and the sub-foremen of our gigantic federal machine. He is his own supervisor and trouble-shooter. Broken parts are brought to him for patching and he undertakes to patch them. Bruised feelings are brought for his treatment and he sets about annoying them."
"No man could do all these things well. No president should try," he wrote.

U. S. National Bank Shows Deposit Gain
The United States National bank reports in its official statement of condition as of October 18, deposits of \$398,585,376.95 as compared with deposits of \$328,571,624.97 at the time of the comptroller's last call as of June 30. The gain in deposits over the 3 1/2 months is shown as \$70,013,751.98.

Daniel D. Gage, district rent executive, calls attention to the rent control requirement to report changes of tenancy. All landlords of houses, apartments, or rooms rented in private homes
