

ELLSWORTH LISTS APPOINTMENTS TO NAVAL ACADEMY

Charles R. Braley, Jr., Robert N. Shelby and Frank Dixon Among Alternates.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 2.—Appointments of principals and alternates for two vacancies at the U. S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, Md., were announced today by Congressman Harris Ellsworth, representative of the 4th District of Oregon. The two principal appointments, with three alternates for each, are as follows:

George Ferris Jubber, Grants Pass, principal; Charles Reese Braley, Jr., 245 Valley View drive, Medford, first alternate; Alan Bryan Knudtson, Roseburg, second alternate; Robert Norman Shelby, Jacksonville Star Route, Medford, third alternate.

Delton Boyer Pruner, Riddle, principal; Mack Elbert Brown, Jr., Roseburg, first alternate; Claire M. Carver, Mapleton, second alternate; Frank Nixon, 526 W. 10th street, Medford, third alternate.

The appointments are based on the grades made in a preliminary qualifying examination given by the U. S. Civil Service Commission in July. Some of those competing for the vacancies were on military duty out of the country and returns on their examinations were slow in reaching Washington, resulting in delay in making the appointments. Several of the appointees are enlisted in the Navy 12-V training program.

ALBERS Corn Meal Recipe '14



SPIDER CORN BREAD

1/2 cup sifted flour
1/2 cup sugar
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. baking powder
1 cup Albers Corn Meal

1 cup milk
1/2 cup water
1 egg, beaten
1/2 cup butter, margarine, or lard
1/2 cup drippings

Sift flour, sugar, salt and baking powder; stir in corn meal. Mix milk and water; add 1 cup of the mixture to beaten egg and stir into dry ingredients. Melt butter, margarine or drippings in a hot skillet, turning skillet to grease sides. Pour in batter, then pour remaining milk-and-water over top. Do not stir. (This makes a line of creamy custard through the corn bread after baking.) Bake in a moderate oven (375° F.) 25 to 30 min. Cut in pie-shaped pieces and serve. Eat with fork, with butter or gravy.
