JAPANESE FLAG IS SENT HOME BY SERGEANT EADS

A Japanese flag taken from the body of a Japanese soldier killed by Sgt. John Eads during the battle of Finschafen is on display at the Chamber of Commerce. The sergeant was wounded during the battle, which took place during the latter part of September, and is in an army hospital on New Guinea. In addition to his wounds, the sergeant is also suffering from malaria, his recent letters state. The flag, dirty and full of bullet holes, was sent to Mrs. Eads, who is making her home with her parents, the Rev. and Mrs. T. O. Satterfield, 726 West Fourth St. Sgt. Eads has never seen his five-months-old daughter.

Sgt. Eads has written his wife that he and four companions were surprised by a Japanese patrol. During the ensuing fracas, the soldier was wounded in the right elbow. He retaliated by mowing down the Jap with his machine gun. He removed the flag from the body and shortly after a bomb hit close by and the sergeant was literally blown from the foxhole in which he had been taking cover, suffering severe concussion.

Attached to the flag is the record tag for wounded used by the army, showing the medical treatment given the sergeant on the battle field.
