White Pine Logs Ceiling Elevated

Washington, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—The Office of Price Administration today raised the ceiling price of western white pine logs produced in Washington and Oregon areas west of the Cascade mountains by approximately \$1 per 1000 feet log scale.

New maximums for logs produced in the southern Oregon-Tillamook district are \$2 per 1000 feet below those for the other three districts. This is the customary industry differential. OPA said.
