

AIRCRAFT MAKERS FACE BANKRUPTCY ON PEACE ARRIVAL

Consolidated-Vultee Chairman Says Contract Termination Is Problem.

New York, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—The aircraft industry will be bankrupt 30 days after the war if there is no proper solution to the contract termination problem, Tom M. Girdler, chairman of Consolidated-Vultee Aircraft corporation, told the opening session today of the Second War congress and the forty-eighth annual convention of the National Association of Manufacturers.

He called for an early determination of government policies on the termination of contracts, the disposal of government owned plants, and the ending of wartime controls and restrictions.

Unity Urged

He urged that post-war plans be built on war experience and said the key to a better America lay in terms of higher standards of living and production. He called for unity of labor, management, government, and agriculture.

He outlined four cornerstones for cooperation of industry and labor: Recognition of the principle of collective bargaining; recognition of the right of employees to join or not to join any labor organization; scrapping of the "class conflict" idea in labor-management relations; and mutual understanding of problems of both, incentive for investment and work—a fair return for venture capital, and fair wages for employees.

Maj. Gen. Levin H. Campbell, Jr., army chief of ordnance, also speaking at the opening session, described the power of American industry as the greatest ever mobilized in the history of the world.

Dixie Trainmen

Call Off Strike

Atlanta, Ga., Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—Union officials announced today that a strike of 360 engineers, trainmen and yardmen of the Atlanta, Birmingham and Coast railroad, scheduled for 10 p. m. CWT, had been called off, at least temporarily, pending arrival of a national mediation board representative.

E. E. Oster, vice president of the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen, said the board had sent an urgent request that the walkout be postponed.

BUREAUCRATIC PERIL

SEEN BY RADIO HEAD

Washington, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—President Roosevelt's Trammel of the National Broadcasting company said today that government control of radio was desired by "bureaucrats" filled with excessive zeal to apply new social concepts to American industry. "The more successful broadcasting became," he said, "the more opportunities it presented for exploitation by those in government who saw in broadcasting a powerful instrument to be used in repackaging America."
