New York, Dec. 15.—(U.P.) President Roosevelt, in a message in connection with the forthcoming drive for funds to fight infantile paralysis, said today that "surrender of disease on the home front must also be unconditional."
"There can be no armistice with the crippling," the president's message said.
The eleventh annual appeal for funds to battle the disease will be conducted between January 14 and 31, Basil O'Connor, president of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, announced. The drive will be

climaxed by nation-wide celebrations of the president's birthday.
