Baker, now fully recovered, expected to be able to return to the store today.

## COLEMAN MADE NATIONAL HEAD OF YMCA PHASE

The Rev. R. W. Coleman, who resigned as pastor of the First Christian church in Medford last June to work with the army and navy department of the national Y.M.C.A., yesterday received word of his appointment as national director of the Christian emphasis work of the department. He is to succeed the Rev. Marion J. Creeger of New York City, who after a visit to Medford last spring selected Rev. Coleman as one of 12 regional workers for the new Christian emphasis program.

Since leaving Medford last June, Rev. Coleman has resided in San Francisco and has carried on the new program through USOs of the southwest region of the nation. As national director of the program, he will have headquarters in New York City and the family will leave soon for the east coast.

**Supervisor Here**  
Word of the new appointment was received in Medford this morning by Ralph Scott, regional supervisor of the army and navy department of the "Y," who is in Medford to visit the Riverside USO and confer with the staff. During his several years residence here, the Rev. Coleman was active in various religious and civic circles. After the start of the war and establishment of Camp White, he formed the first coordinating council for recreation activities, was a member of the Jackson County Recreation committee, was chairman of the first operating committee of the Riverside USO and on the board of the Medford war nursery school.

The Rev. Creeger has accepted a new position with the federal Council of Churches of Christ of America.
