

S. S. JACKSONVILLE NAMED IN HONOR HISTORIC VILLAGE

Descendants of Pioneer
Families Invited to Kaiser
Yard Launching Dec. 23.

December 23 has been announced as the date of the launching of the S. S. Jacksonville at Portland, second tanker built at the Kaiser shipyards to be named after historic southern Oregon places. First was the S. S. Table Rock, launched a few weeks ago.

County Judge J. B. Coleman is to attend the launching as a special guest of the Kaiser company and invitations have been extended to K. K. Kubli and Benjamin Beekman, descendants of Jacksonville pioneer families now living in Portland, to attend the ceremonies. The Kublis were early settlers in the Applegate district and Mr. Beekman's father operated the pioneer Beekman bank in Jacksonville in the famous "gold rush" period of Jacksonville history.

Crater Lake Soon
Announcement of the launching date was made by Tom Hoxey, representative of the Kaiser company, who stated that in the near future a tanker will be christened S. S. Crater Lake.

4TH ARMY CHIEF PAYS FIRST VISIT TO CAMP WHITE

Camp White, Dec. 18.—Lt. Gen. William H. Simpson, commanding general of the Fourth army, paid his initial visit to Camp White Thursday where he conferred with Maj. Gen. James L. Bradley, 96th Infantry Division commander; Brig. Gen. Amos Thomas, post commander, and four army special troops commanders.

Gen. Simpson, who assumed command of the Fourth army this fall, came to Camp White from Fort Lewis and Camp Adair, where he inspected other units of his command.

Following conferences with Gen. Bradley, members of the division staff and commanders, Gen. Simpson toured the division area.

"From what I've seen, I am very much impressed with the spirit and general appearance of the division," he said. "I expect to see more on later visits."

With the general on his inspection were: Lt. Col. George Milliner, deputy chief of staff; Maj. Davenport Plumer, Jr., and Capt. Kenneth L. Fox, aides-de-camp.

Col. W. Roy Bradley, Fourth army chaplain, also visited Camp White today, conferring with Lt. Col. John W. Fry, 96th Division chaplain.
