Salem, Ore., Dec. 21.—(UP)—A \$49,000 suit against the Southern Pacific railroad and the California-Oregon Power company has been settled out of court for \$30,000, the state highway department announced today.

J. M. Devers, highway commission attorney, said the action was filed in Klamath county circuit court for damages caused when a dike burst and flooded The Dalles-California highway near Algoma in Klamath county.
