WIVES, RELATIVES VISITING SOLDIERS IN NEED OF ROOMS

Arrival of the holiday season has increased the number of requests from servicemen for rooms for wives and parents coming to visit soldiers at Camp White, according to Adj. Charles Cox, director of the West Main USO where the central housing desk is located. Local citizens were urged today to make extra rooms available to these people wherever possible, and it was pointed out that many of the wives and mothers have traveled long distances to spend just a few days near sons or husbands.

Adj. Cox states that a critical situation still exists as to housing accommodations for servicemen and their families in this area. During November, 1182 placements were made through the housing desk, absorbing vacancies existing at that time. Requests are still numerous, and Adj. Cox urged today that all who can make rooms available telephone the desk, 2028, and list them immediately.

Any families desiring to have a serviceman and his wife, or any number of single servicemen in their homes for Christmas dinner are invited to telephone the West Main USO, 3900, and arrangements will be made.
