Typical Nazi City Shows War Losses

On the German Frontier, Dec. 22—(UP)—The German newspaper Bodensee Rundschau, reviewing German war losses, today described Konstanz as "characteristic" in scope and said the German garrison city listed more than 10 per cent of its 34,000 inhabitants as war dead up to the middle of December.

At least 3,794 inhabitants have been killed, the newspaper said, as compared with 3,088 during the first world war.
