

COMMITTEEMEN IN MEETINGS SOON TO PICK OFFICERS

Jackson Co. Precinct Leaders Must Convene and Appoint Within 40 Days.

Next event of political importance in the county will be the meetings of the newly elected precinct committeemen of both major parties, which will be called in the near future by Kenneth Denman, Medford, Republican central committee chairman and V. D. Miller, Ashland, Democratic central committee chairman. G. R. Carter, county clerk, states that according to Oregon election laws, the meetings must be held within 40 days after the primary election, with election of officers to take place during the meetings.

Committeemen elected at the primary, held May 19, have already been notified of their election by Carter and certificates of election will be issued by the clerk immediately following the first meeting of the newly elected

ed committeemen to all who qualify. Persons elected may qualify by accepting in writing and filing the acceptance letter with the county clerk before or at the time of the first meeting.

May Appoint
Two committeemen for each precinct are provided by law, but in many cases there are no candidates or the persons elected fail to qualify. These vacancies may be filled by appointment, these usually being made by the executive committee of the central committee, formed after the first meeting and elections. The election laws also state that the central committee shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman, who shall be of opposite sex, congressional committeemen and five district nominating committeemen.

The retiring officers serve until their successors are elected, and the committeemen serve for two years from the date of the first meeting of the central committee after the primary election.

Washington, June 13—(U.P.)—The Office of price administration announced today that 7,000,000 pairs of "odd lot" shoes will become ration-free at specified price reductions between July 10 and July 29.

Certain types of men's and women's shoes of all sizes and youth's and boys' shoes, sizes one to six, will become available for purchase without stamps to aid dealers in disposing of broken sizes and styles.

GOOD RESPONSE TO BLOOD CALL; MORE REQUIRED

A good response to the call issued by the Jackson County Public Health association for blood donors to form the list to be used in necessary transfusions was reported this week. More volunteers are needed, however, the committee heading the drive, stated and tests will be made throughout June.

Anyone willing to give blood in transfusion to any individual in need of it, is asked to come in and be tested that his type of blood may be registered and his or her name added to the list of willing donors.

It will not be necessary for donors to telephone the laboratories for appointment. The Community hospital will test volunteers any afternoon, preferably Saturday, from 4:00 to 6:00, the Sacred Heart hospital any afternoon from 3:00 to 5:00 and the Medford Center building Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday afternoons from 12 (noon) to 2:00.

The need for establishment of a list of blood donors in this county has been realized in many emergencies through the years. The amount of time to be saved by previous typing of blood may often represent the difference between life and death to the individual in need of a transfusion, committee workers explained.

The list of donors to be compiled after tests are made will be maintained by the Health association and placed in all hospitals of the county so that doctors will know whom to call when an emergency arises.

ASHLAND ANGLERS CATCH TOO MANY

Leonard Wertz and Carl Neils Hegler, both of Ashland, each charged with possession of more than the bag limit of fish, were fined in Justice of the Peace Tucker's court yesterday.

Hegler was fined \$25 and costs on two counts, exceeding the bag limit and possession of too many trout under six inches in length. Wertz was fined \$25 and costs for exceeding the bag limit. He had 33 trout. The limit is 15.

The two fishermen were arrested by a state police game warden while returning to Ashland from the Dead Indian

country. The trout were caught from a stream in that area. James John Petersen charged with fishing with more than one line last week and released with bail at \$50 failed to appear. A warrant for his arrest was signed by Justice Tucker today and placed in the hands of state police today for service.

MEDFORD LEGION FIRST TO REPORT FOR BOYS STATE

Approximately 150 boys have made application for enrollment in the eighth annual session of Beaver Boys State, sponsored by the American Legion at Oregon State college, June 25th to July 2nd, according to announcement by Lee Bostwick, of Portland, department Boys' State chairman.

First Post to report in Oregon is Medford, where Col. W. H. Paine has enrolled 29 boys. The Medford delegation will include Harry Nordwick, Beaver Boys State governor.

Second Post to officially register boys for the session was Clatskanie, with three enrolled. Preliminary reports from other posts throughout Oregon indicate the following representation: Hillsboro 10, Roseburg 5, Klamath Falls 10, Aurora 3, Gresham 2, Navy Post No. 101, Portland 4, Cottage Grove 2, Astoria 25, Salem 35, Forest Grove 5, Bend 4, Hood River 4, and Albany 10.

2nd Lt. Keaveny Wins Air Medal In Italy Action

15th Army Air Force—Second Lt. Jack F. Keaveny, 20, of Medford, pilot of a 15th Army Air Force Liberator bomber, has been awarded the air medal, it was announced by 15th Army Air Force Headquarters. This honor was bestowed upon him "for meritorious achievement in aerial flight while participating in sustained operational activities against the enemy." Lt. Keaveny is stationed in Italy with the 15th AAF Liberator bombardment group which has been bombing German-held targets in Austria, Roumania and northern Italy.

Lt. Keaveny is the son of John Keaveny of Jacksonville. He was graduated from Medford high school in 1941, where he played football and was on the track team.

CANNING SCHOOL WILL BE FREE TO ALL INTERESTED

The victory food preservation school to be held at the courthouse auditorium Wednesday at 1:30 p. m. under auspices of the Jackson County Nutrition committee will be free to all homemakers.

Mrs. Vivian Freeman, one of the leading canning specialists of the northwest, will conduct the school, assisted by Miss Marian J. Farrell, home demonstration agent, who will give suggestions on proper methods of freezing foods.

The very latest information available on methods and procedures will be given homemakers so they may be better equipped to cope with their canning problems.

Mrs. Freeman will conduct a question and answer forum at the close of the demonstration. Some of the questions often asked are:

Do you know why your peaches and pears turn dark brown when home canned?
Can you keep home canned strawberries from floating?
Can you keep fruit successfully without use of sugar?
Can you prevent the liquid from boiling out of your jars?
Why do pickles turn soft or shrivel or hollow?

What equipment is necessary to successfully can meat, fish and vegetables?
Is it possible to can tomatoes without processing?

Can you make jelly without using pectin or boiling to a jelly stage?

How much liquid should you add when home canning meat?

Why are corn, peas and beans known as the "three demons" in home canning?

What is flat-sour and how is it prevented?
Is it necessary to add salt to home canned vegetables?

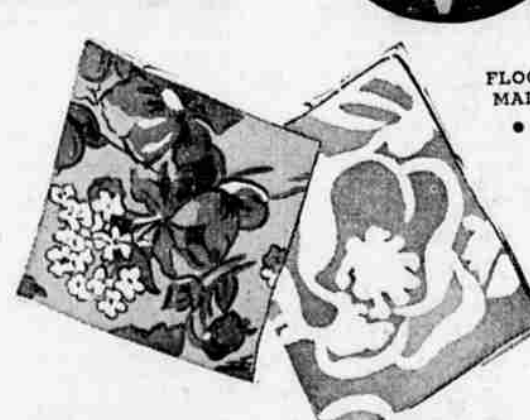
