Included in the letter should be all pertinent information, such as the number of the dependency allowance application, the serviceman's name and serial number, copies of previous correspondence related to the problem and any other data available concerning the situation.

Counties included in this district are: Lake, Klamath, Jackson, Josephine, Curry and Coos in Oregon, and Del Norte, Siskiyou, Humboldt, Trinity and Shasta in California.
