SALVAGE OF HAY AIM OF FARMERS

Hay farmers of the valley are busy in the bright warm sunshine turning over their first cuttings dampened by the heavy rain storms of the past week. County Agent Robert G. Fowler reported today that although the hay had lain on wet ground for several days, a goodly portion of it may be salvaged. He stated approximately 40 per cent of the hay crop was in the rain, most of it on dry farms where only one cutting is made. He further explained every wisp of hay was needed with feed shortages looming.

No damage was caused to pear crop by the storms of the past week, according to Assistant County Agent C. B. Cordy, who said the present sunshine was welcomed by orchardists and farmers.

Post Publisher Sues Columnist On Romance Hint

Washington, June 23.—(U.P.)—Mrs. Dorothy S. Thackrey, owner and publisher of the New York Post, and her husband, Theodore O. Thackrey, today filed libel suits for \$500,000 each against Mrs. Eleanor Patterson, publisher of the Washington Times-Herald and Austin Cesselin, Times-Herald society columnist.

The suits charged that Mrs. Patterson's column "These charming People" as printed in Wednesday's Times-Herald contained "false and malicious" statements linking Mrs. Thackrey's name romantically with that of Charles B. McCabe, publisher of the New York Daily Mirror.

NAZI GENERAL KILLED—London, June 23.—(U.P.)—A German communiqué, broadcast by DNB news agency, disclosed that the death of Lt. Gen. Hellmich, commander of the German 243rd infantry division, while fighting on the Cherbourg peninsula last Saturday. He was the second German general reported killed in two days.
