GUATEMALA HEADS YIELD TO ARMY

Guatemala City, Guatemala, July 1—(U.P.)—President Jorg Ubico today officially turned over the presidency to a four-man military tribunal which included Minister of War Gen. Daniel Corado, following a week of intense national unrest.

(The announcement of Ubico's resignation followed persistent reports in other Latin American nations of revolt and widespread disturbances in Guatemala.)

Ubico placed railroad and public utility employees under military law and regulations last Tuesday after they had gone on strike in sympathy with striking students. The students had protested against suspension of certain constitutional guarantees by the government.

She said Mell was the baby's father and that he had refused to marry her after asking her to come to his station at Yuma, Ariz., from her home in St. Louis, Mo.
