KAISER TO OPERATE STANDARD GYPSUM CO.

San Francisco, July 26.—(U.P.) Henry J. Kaiser, the Pacific coast's fabulous shipbuilder and post-war planner, today took over the lease and operation of the \$20,000,000 Standard Gypsum Co., dropped into his lap along with \$50,000,000 worth of gypsum by another fabulous millionaire who chose the Kaiser Co. as an "all-star partner."

The dramatic industrial deal, by which the Kaiser interests were given a 50-50 partnership in return for their "know how," was the west coast business leader's biggest move to date toward getting into the mass scale post-war home-building industry.

FEHL OVERRULED IN SALARY SUIT

Following arguments on a demurrer and motion in the suit of Earl H. Fehl against Jackson county for \$11,000 Fehl claims is due as his salary as county judge, following his conviction on ballot theft, Circuit Judge H. K. Hanna overruled both, and granted Fehl ten days in which to file further proceedings.

Fehl contends he is entitled to pay for the period for which he was elected as county judge. He served but three months of the term before he was convicted, and a successor named for the county office.
