BEWARE THE CHARLATAN WHO GETS ALL OF THE TONSIL

In the talk about "Too Much Tonsillotomy" the other day I explained that tonsillotomy means cutting the tonsil or "clipping" it as in removing the bulk of tonsils which are either enlarged or infected. Tonsillotomy means removing the entire tonsil, every bit of it, leaving no trace of tonsil tissue in the throat.

To hear some operators talk about it, one might think tonsillotomy a marvelous thorough and efficient piece of surgery. But not if one knows one's onions.

It is conceivable, and in case of a grave suspicion of, say, cancer in the tonsil, it might be justifiable to attempt to remove every bit of tonsil tissue, leaving no such tissue in the throat. But in my studied opinion there is no good reason for subjecting the patient to more prolonged anesthesia (local or general) or more extensive trauma or injury or disfigurement in an attempt to "get all of the tonsil tissue" in cases of simple tonsil hypertrophy or enlargement.

In cases of infected tonsils, especially when a septic focus in a tonsil is held responsible for some systemic trouble such as chronic arthritis.

That complex is based on a false premise in the first place. No one has ever shown that tonsil tissue is in itself harmful in any way. No matter how large tonsils and adenoids (third or pharyngeal tonsil) may be, they do no harm to child or adult except through the mechanical accident of obstruction—that is, the enlarged tonsil or adenoid calls for no treatment unless it happens to (1) obstruct
