

ANN SHERIDAN IN GAY MUSICAL HIT CRATERIAN TODAY

Dennis Morgan Co-Stars—
Many Song Hits Featured
—Twin-Bill at Rialto.

Twenty-four songs, 18 of them oldies guaranteed to produce nostalgia, and six original numbers heard for the first time, are the vocal score for "Shine On Harvest Moon," Ann Sheridan-Dennis Morgan starrer opening today at the Craterian.

The new numbers, with music by Moe K. Jerome and lyrics by Kim Gannon are "We're Doing Our Best For You," and "Rainy Days," sister-act personality songs for Miss Sheridan and Irene Manning; "Thank You For The Dance," a waltz song for Irene Manning and a male chorus; "So Dumb But So Beautiful," comedy song for Jack Carson and Marie Wilson; and "I Go For You" and "Time Waits For No One," love songs for Dennis Morgan and Miss Sheridan. While these tunes have been given a flavor of the 1908-1910 period of the picture by Jerome and Gannon, they're also singable by today's standards.

Oldies to be heard, with added special material by Jerome and Gannon include the title song "Shine On Harvest Moon." At the Rialto "Her Primitive Man" tops the twin bill, supported by the thriller, "Detective Kitty O'Day."

REVEAL ROCKET GUNS DEVELOPED IN CALIFORNIA

Pasadena, Cal., Aug. 5.—(U.P.)—Rocket weapons that helped to curb the submarine menace and aided Allied invasions of North Africa, Europe and the Pacific were developed by the navy and a group of scientists and engineers at California Institute of Technology, the navy revealed tonight.

The project, which began in September, 1941, is continuing, the navy said, with most recent developments still secret.

"Magnitude and development of the work can be seen from the fact that rocket research and development stand almost at the top of manpower and materials priorities and the fact that the army and navy have placed rocket production contracts totaling many millions," a statement from the naval ordnance bureau declared.

"One type of rocket weapon developed by this cooperative effort has been in general use in anti-submarine warfare for over two years.

"Another was used in invasions of North Africa, Sicily, Italy and France, in the landing on Arawe and in subsequent island hopping in the south Pacific and has become standard equipment for all amphibious operations.

"More recently airborne rockets have been developed as armament for carrier based and amphibian planes and have been used successfully against German submarine and against Japanese shipping and land installations in the Pacific."

ABBOT TOO ISOLATED FOR NAVY HOSPITAL USE

Washington, Aug. 5.—(U.P.)—Camp Abbot, Ore., is too far from large cities to be utilized by the navy as a hospital, department officials said today.

An effort had been made to turn the camp into navy department use after the army had the site declared surplus property.

COOPER MAY FACE CIVIL ACTION ON MORALS CHARGE

South Bend, Ind., Aug. 5.—(U.P.)—St. Joseph County authorities today asked the navy for custody of Jackie Cooper, former movie actor, to face a charge of contributing to the delinquency of two teen-aged girls during a hotel "drinking brawl" July 22.

Cooper, who gained Hollywood fame as a child film star, now is a member of the navy's V-12 program, stationed at the University of Notre Dame.

Deputy Prosecutor Leo L. Cook presented the formal request to Cmdr. Walter S. Gabel, executive officer of the Notre Dame Naval Training station, for permission to arrest the 22-year-old Hollywood actor and a fellow V-12 student, George Bender, 24, Sheffield, Ill., who also is charged with contributing to the delinquency of the girls and having intimate relations with the younger one, a 15-year-old South Bend school girl.

It was possible that Cooper's case would reach Secretary of the Navy James V. Forrestal for review and a decision. Gabel said he would forward the charges to the Ninth Naval District headquarters at Great Lakes, Ill., for relay to Forrestal at Washington.

Cooper, whose last movie "Where Are Your Children?", cast him in the role of a sailor and dealt with juvenile delinquency, was restricted to his base, along with Bender.

Also accused on the delinquency charges were Miss Pauline Frederick, 19, said to be Cooper's companion at the drinking party, and Olie Lowery, 49, negro waiter at the hotel who allegedly served liquor to the minors.

Miss Frederick was arrested today at her home, where she pleaded illness. She was released immediately under \$1000 bond. Lowery was freed under \$2000 bond.

WOMAN SCOFFS AT HOMICIDE CHARGE

Salinas, Cal., Aug. 5.—(U.P.)—Mrs. Frances Andrews, 37, state-ly daughter of a wealthy oil man and horse breeder, chatted with a girl vagrant in her jail cell today while the state set out to prove its accusation that she murdered 19-year-old Jay Lovett near her Carmel valley ranch July 15.

Mrs. Andrews, blonde and chic—even in jail—scoffed at the indictment and reiterated her professed belief that young Lovett committed suicide by shooting himself in the head with the automatic pistol found near his body.

She was supported in this contention by her tall, 42-year-old husband, Frank, an army corporal, who derided District Attorney Anthony Brazil for pres-

ing the case and hotly denied that his wife was responsible for young Lovett's death.

WOMEN GO ON STRIKE OVER REST PERIODS

Sacramento, Aug. 5.—(U.P.)—Four Sacramento box factories manufacturing ammunition cases were idle tonight following a dispute at one factory over rest periods for women.

The dispute started at the State Box company, where, according to Business Agent Don Riggs of the Boxmakers' union local, women employees were refused time to visit rest rooms in addition to a 10-minute rest period every two hours. Riggs said additional time is required by state law.

BRITON'S LETTER SAYS BUZZ BOMB SIEGE EXCITING

Germany's robot bombs may be taking a heavy toll of lives and causing much property damage in southern England, but in typical British fashion the people—or some of them at least—understate the seriousness of the "buzz bomb" raids by calling them merely "exciting."

In a letter to Mr. and Mrs. Harold Frye of 803 West Second street, Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Prentiss of Bexley Heath, Kent, wrote that "we are both safe and well and experiencing some exciting times with the flying bombs." They went on to say that "perhaps this is Hitler's last card, and if it is he has backed another loser."

Appreciate U. S. Aid

The letter also expressed the appreciation of the English people for America's effort in the war, saying "we have just heard on the radio how splendidly the American soldiers are doing in Normandy; only four miles from Cherbourg. We have certainly got to thank America a lot.

"Well, let's hope that by the end of the year the war will be finished with Germany, and then we can all go out to wipe the Japs off the map."
