IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 27th day of July, 1944, 21 Jars of the above-mentioned Apple Butter, more particularly described as "Catalina Brand Pure Apple Butter-California Preserving Co., Los Angeles, Calif. Net Contents 1 lb. 12 oz." were arrested and taken into the possession of and now are in the possession of the United States Marshal for the District of Oregon, pursuant to a warrant and process duly issued by the Clerk of the United States District Court for the District of Oregon, in a suit for condemnation and forfeiture entitled, "United States of America, Libellant, vs. 11 Cases, more or less, each containing 12 jars of APPLE BUTTER," brought under the provisions of Section 334, Title 21, U.S.C.A., wherein it is sought to have the above-described article of food condemned and forfeited for the following reasons: That on or about Jan. 19, 24, 1944, California Preserving Company did sell, ship and consign from Los Angeles, California, in interstate commerce to Medford, Oregon, the said 11 Cases, more or less, each containing 12 jars of Catalina Brand Pure Apple Butter; that the said Apple Butter is adulterated within the purview of Title 21, Section 342(b)(2) U.S.C.A., in that an apple product insufficiently concentrated by heat has been substituted wholly or in part for Apple Butter, a food for which a definition and standard of identity has been prescribed by regulations promulgated pursuant to Title 21, Section 341, U.S.C.A.; that the said article of food is misbranded within the purview of Title 21, Section 343(a), U.S.C.A., in that the name of the article "Apple Butter" is false and misleading as applied to a product which fails to conform to the definition and standard of identity for Apple Butter; and, is further misbranded under Title 21, Section 343(g)(1), U.S.C.A., in that it purports to be and is represented as Apple Butter, a food for which a definition and standard of identity has been prescribed by regulations promulgated pursuant to Section 341, Title 21, U.S.C.A., and it fails to conform to such definition and standard since the soluble solids content of the finished article is less than 43 percent, whereas such definition and standard prescribes that the soluble solids content of finished Apple Butter is not less than 43 percent, determined by the method in such regulations prescribed; that all persons claiming any right, title or interest in and to the said article of food are hereby notified to appear on or before the 5th day of September, 1944, in the Federal Court at Portland, Oregon, to show cause, if any there be, why the same should not be decreed against and forfeited to the United States as adulterated and misbranded food. POOR CIRCULATION

Statistics of one of the large life insurance companies reports that coronary heart disease has



apparently increased and is still increasing this having been given as the cause of death in 4.7 per hundred thousand in 1930, in 24.9 per hundred thousand in 1935, and in 34.9 per hundred thousand in 1940.

Whether such statistics or any statistics show that coronary or other forms of heart disease are actually on the increase I don't know. Some medical authorities seem to believe there is more heart disease now than there was twenty, fifty or a hundred years ago. That a good many laymen harbor the same belief is impressed upon me by letters from laymen.

In the conviction of these ambitious but untrained (that is, untrained in the science of Pathology) experts that the alarming increase in heart disease, as they see it, is clearly due to smoking, drinking, coffee, eating meat or too much meat, or even to much starchy food—which, in their fancy, causes "gas", and the "gas" of course "presses on the heart" and there you are.

Actually there is no reason to imagine that any of these causes, excepting smoking, may contribute to heart disease. In regard to smoking, it is the consensus of medical opinion, as nearly as I can determine, that it does cause heart disease, especially coronary occlusion (narrowing, constriction or stoppage of a branch of the coronary artery).

Efficiency of the circulation depends not alone on the condition of the heart, but also upon the state of the conduits or blood flows. It depends on the state of the large and small arteries which one can feel and see but even more, perhaps, on the state of the smallest terminal tubes, called arterioles, which are visible only under the microscope—and I don't mean "capillaries", for nobody can see or has seen a capillary. It is mainly through the con-

traction, narrowing or constriction of these arterioles or relaxation, widening or dilation of these minute terminal tubes that tobacco, for instance, (rather tobacco smoke or whatever element or component of tobacco smoke may be responsible—nicotine, carbon monoxide, furfural, ammonia?)—you pays your money and takes your choice, although I plump for carbon monoxide as the important factor) affects the circulation. The effects of drugs on the circulation are largely brought about in the same way.

The caliber or diameter of the arterioles is changeable, being under the control of the portion of the autonomic, automatic or unconscious (independent of the will) sympathetic nervous system called vasomotor or nerves, such as toxins, ductless gland hormones (notable adrenin), and emotions—the emotions acting by producing increased or decreased secretion of adrenin.

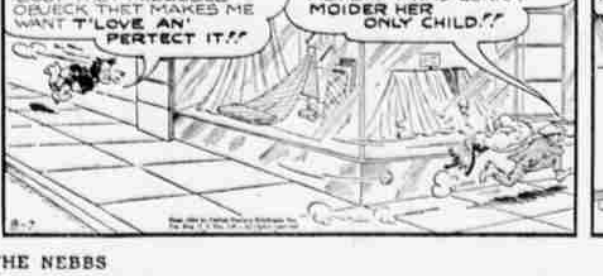

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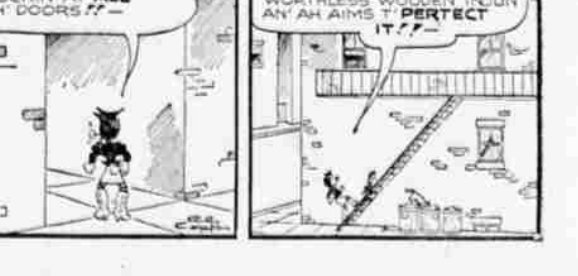
