WARREN'S BALK CLAIMED DUE TO DEMO STRENGTH

Refusal To Take GOP Vice Presidential Nomination Explained by O'Mahoney.

Washington, Aug. 10.—(U.P.) Sen. Joseph C. O'Mahoney, D., Wyo., chairman of the Democratic senatorial campaign committee, said today that a survey indicating California would go Democratic in the November election influenced Gov. Earl Warren to decline the Repub-

lican vice-presidential nomination. O'Mahoney made the assertion in a statement answering claims of the Republican senatorial campaign committee that the GOP is sure to win five senate seats from the Democrats in November and could win control of the senate with victories in six "doubtful" states.

Downey Seen Sure
California was one of the states which the Republicans listed as "doubtful." O'Mahoney prophesied re-election of Sen. Sheridan Downey. "It was because Gov. Warren had made a survey of California prior to the Republican national convention which convinced him that the state is overwhelmingly Democratic that he declined the Republican nomination for vice-president, which then fell into the unwilling lap of Gov. Bricker," O'Mahoney said. The Republicans listed New Jersey, Indiana, Iowa and Idaho

as "certain for the GOP in November," claimed New York if Gov. Thomas E. Dewey carries that state, and listed among other possibilities Kentucky, Missouri and Washington.

O'Mahoney claimed Indiana and Illinois for the Democrats and said the "if" concerning New York state "obviously is a very big one."

Idaho Held Doubtful
His comments on the other states included:

Idaho—"A very large vote was cast against Gov. Bottolfsen (the GOP senate nominee) in the Republican primary based on the

fact, I am informed, that he used his executive authority with the Idaho legislature to defeat the will of the people as expressed in the 1942 election with respect to the old age pensions. I have no hesitation in saying that the Republicans ought, from their own point of view, to list Idaho among the doubtful states."

Washington—"Sen. Mon Wallgren (nominee for governor) and Congressman (Warren G.) Magnusen (senate nominee) have already proven their vote-getting abilities and Washington is acknowledged to be Roosevelt territory."

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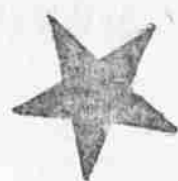
