ple out of a thousand in all sec-
tions of this country, rural, ur-

tan, think enough of their teeth to visit a dentist in the course of a year, according to a survey made by the U. S. Public Health Service. These 269 persons who visit the dentist are ap-

parently not impelled to do so by superior intelligence or wise comprehension of the vital importance of saving their teeth. That is painfully evident in the facts elicited by the survey: For each of the 269 persons in this cross section of the entire population in the course of the year there were 47 fillings, 286 extractions, 18 bridges, 17 crowns, 12 plates and—

This is the funny part!—only 105 cleanings of the teeth. Think of it—only slightly more than one in each ten persons in these benighted states has his or her teeth properly cleaned once a year. This burns me up when I think of all the childish sneeds obscure dentists have leveled at me for my teaching that brushing does not save the teeth. If you wish to keep your teeth clean you simply must have them cleaned, scaled and polished at least once a year by your dentist. There is just one alternative—exclude from your diet all denaturized, refined white flour, refined white sugar, and the thousand and one sissy items made from them. To do what you'll require a pretty rugged character.

The longer I enjoy my thirty-two teeth (most of 'em are mine, some of them were, till I paid the last installment, my dentist's) and the more I see of the sad consequences to health of loss of teeth, the stronger is my conviction that for every tooth lost and not immediately replaced by a functionally efficient denture one must deduct from one's life expectancy from one to two years. On that basis I say every tooth is worth a thousand dollars.

It is a source of endless wonderment why so many people, even people with a fair common school or high school education and people who can apparently afford the necessities and some of the luxuries of life, seem content to limp along for the few short years remaining to them, with from one to half a dozen or more teeth missing. Worse still, many of them seem to think that if only back teeth
